Whereas, the law creates a new article 25A of the Public Health Law and eliminates Public Health Law 4164 which requires a board certified physician to provide medical care for any live birth that is the result of an abortion, where the baby is left to die unless the mother decides otherwise, and

Whereas, the law permits abortion at any time during pregnancy if the health care provider deems it necessary for the life, health and well-being of the mother, and

Whereas, the health and safety of the mother includes all factors, such as, physical, emotional, psychological, financial, and the women's age relevant to the well-being of the patient, and

Whereas, there is concern for the health of pregnant women as serious complications may occur more often during late term abortions.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Carmel urge all members of the New York State Legislature to introduce and pass legislation to repeal this law and protect the life of the unborn while also caring for the health and well-being of the mother, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Town Board of the Town of Carmel petitions all local and county governments to introduce legislation encouraging the New York State Legislature to take such action in support of this initiative.

Prior to the roll call vote, Councilman Barile responded to a resident's inquiry with regard to the actual cost of all of the proposed improvements in Carmel Water District #2 by clarifying that the estimated cost of \$13,301,400 stated above pertains only to the distribution system. He explained that the project cost for system-wide upgrades, which also include the construction of a new treatment plant, water storage tanks and miscellaneous expenses, is estimated at between \$30 million and \$40 million.

Councilman Barile further explained with regard to the \$13,301,400 that the estimated annual debt service per taxpayer if bonded over fifteen years would be \$460.65 and \$375.02 if bonded over 20 years. Councilman Barile noted that this cost relates to just about a third of the total system-wide upgrades and that Carmel Water District #2 taxpayers should be prepared to pay between \$1,500 and \$2,000 annually for a completely new water system.

Supervisor Schmitt spoke regarding the need to disseminate information about the Public Hearing in connection with this significant matter out to the residents in Carmel Water District #2. A discussion followed.

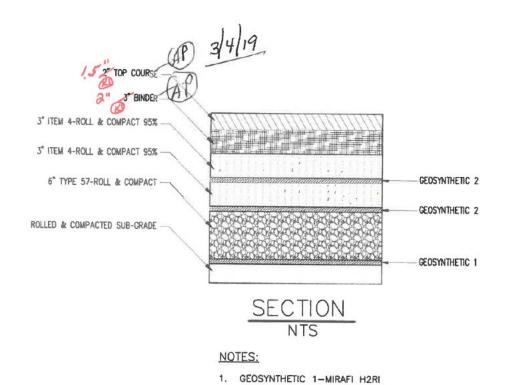

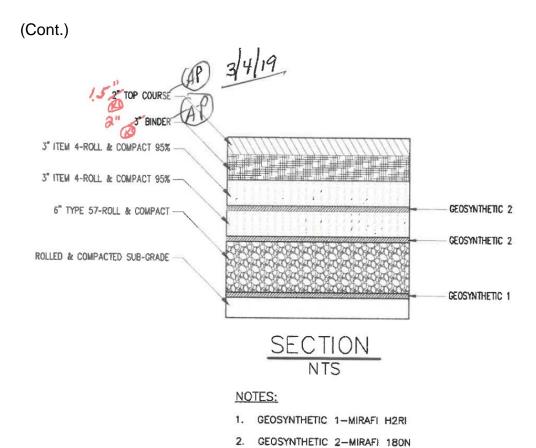

Supervisor Schmitt stated the available balance to be \$250,000 after this expenditure. Discussion regarding the matter ensued.

He explained that a wire came down on Glenvue Drive and he has been unsuccessful in having someone from the telecommunications company make the repair.

Councilwoman McDonough indicated that she would follow up with the cable issue.
