

### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

TOWN OF CARMEL AND

THE CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION, INC. LOCAL 840, AFSCME, AFL-CIO

IT IS HEREBY AGREED by and between the Town of Carmel and the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc., Local 840, AFSCME, AFL-CIO (the "CSEA") that the collective bargaining agreement ("CBA") between the parties shall be modified as indicated below.

All terms of the January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2021 CBA shall be carried forward and included in the January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2026 CBA, except as amended herein.

This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to ratification of the CSEA bargaining unit and the Town Board.

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Once ratified by the CSEA bargaining unit and the Town Board, this Memorandum of Agreement shall have the full force and effect of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the parties. The parties shall prepare a revised Collective Bargaining Agreement based on this Memorandum of Agreement.

1. The wages referenced in Article X, Section A, shall be increased as follows:

> January 1, 2022 3% of 2021 rates January 1, 2023 2.75% of 2022 rates January 1, 2024 3% of 2023 rates 2.75% of 2024 rates January 1, 2025 January 1, 2026 3% of 2025 rates

- Article X, Section C, Mortgage Tax Revenue Wage Supplement, shall not be carried forward into the CBA, effective January 1, 2022.
- Article XII, Term of Agreement, shall be amended to provide that the CBA shall be effective January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2026.
