The subject property was previously before the Board and approved for a 3 lot subdivision on April 27, 2011. The previously approved project could not be built due to the presence of additional site constraints not previously noted. The project has been redesigned as a 2 lot subdivision and is back before the Board for discussion of the redesigned project.

In response to your recent request, we have reviewed the New York Natural Heritage Program database with respect to an Environmental Assessment for 10- Acre Project, area as indicated on the map you enclosed, located on Long Pond Road, Town of Carmel, Putnam County.

Enclosed is a report of rare or state-listed animals and plants, and significant natural communities, which our database indicates occur, or may occur, on your site or in the immediate vicinity of your site. For most sites, comprehensive field surveys have not been conducted; the enclosed report only includes records from our databases. We cannot provide a definitive statement as to the presence or absence of all rare or state-listed species or significant natural communities. This information should not be substituted for on-site surveys that may be required for environmental impact assessment.

The enclosed report may be included in documents that will be available to the public.
