NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Town Board of the Town of Carmel will conduct a Public Hearing at the Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York 10541 on Wednesday, February 28, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter that evening as possible on a proposed Local Law enacting Chapter 140 of the Code of the Town of Carmel, entitled "Towing and Storage" as follows:

TOWN OF CARMEL
PROPOSED LOCAL LAW # _____ OF THE YEAR 2018
A LOCAL LAW ENACTING CHAPTER 140 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF CARMEL, ENTITLED "TOWING AND STORAGE"

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel, County of Putnam, State of New York as follows:

Section 1: PURPOSE

The purpose of this local law is to establish procedures for the licensing of individuals and entities providing towing and storage services to the Town of Carmel Police Department and to also establish uniform policy and procedures and fees for the towing and storage services to be provided to the Town of Carmel Police Department.

Section 2: AUTHORITY

This chapter is adopted pursuant to the authority, of Article 2, § 10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

SECTION 3: ENACTMENT OF CHAPTER 140

- § 140-1. Purpose and scope; applicability
 - A. The purposes of this chapter are to
 - (1) Establish a requirement and procedure for the licensing of individuals and entities providing towing and storage services to the Town of Carmel Police Department.
 - (2) Establish, in the interest of public safety, a uniform policy for the towing and storage of motor vehicles towed and stored at the request of the Town of Carmel Police Department.
 - (3) Establish uniform fees for towing and storage services.
 - B. This chapter shall apply to all motor vehicle towing and storage operations performed at the request of the Town of Carmel of Police Department.

§140-2. Definitions

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated.

AUTOMOBILE

A private passenger motor vehicle or any vehicle included in the definition of "automobile" under NYS VTL.

BASIC TOWING SERVICE

The removal and transportation of an automobile from a highway, street or other public or private road or a parking area or from a storage facility and other services normally

incident thereto, but does not include recovery of an automobile from a position beyond the right-of-way or berm or from being impaled upon any other object within the right-ofway or berm.

MOTOR VEHICLE

Includes all vehicles propelled other than by muscular power, except such vehicles as run only upon rails or tracks or motorized bicycles.

TOWN OF CARMEL

The Town of Carmel.

TOW OPERATOR

A person engaged in the business of towing and storing motor vehicles or offering the services of a tow vehicle or tow truck and storage services.

TOW VEHICLE OR TOW TRUCK

Those vehicles equipped with a boom or booms, winches, slings, tilt beds, wheel lifts or under-reach equipment specifically designed by their manufacturer for the removal or transport of motor vehicles, including flatbed vehicles, employed for the purpose of towing, transporting, conveying and/or removing motor vehicles which are unable to be operated under their own power from one place to another for which a charge or fee is extracted.

§140-3. License required

- A. No person shall engage in the business of towing or storing motor vehicles at the direction of the Town of Carmel of Police Department without first obtaining a tow operator's license therefor. Nothing herein shall require licensing for the rendering of road service or for the provision of towing and storage services within the Town of Carmel other than at the request of the Town of Carmel Police Department.
- B. The Town of Carmel Police Department is responsible for the approval and issuance of towing and service licenses. The number of licenses issued by the Town of Carmel Police Department shall be determined by the sole discretion of the Chief of Police.
- C. All complete applications shall be forwarded to the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police, or his/her designee, shall have sole discretion in deciding which recipient towing companies will be awarded the licenses. This application process shall be repeated on a yearly basis.

§140-4. Application for license; application fee

- A. Applicants for a license under this chapter shall file with the Town of Carmel Clerk a sworn application on a form to be furnished by the Clerk which shall include the following information and certification.
 - (1) The full name and address of the applicant. If the application is made for a corporation, it shall state the names and addresses of the officers and directors thereof, its registered agent and the names and residential addresses of every stockholder owning more than 10% of the issued stock.
 - (2) The year, make and type of each tow vehicle used in said business, its vehicle identification number, registration number and registered owner.
 - (3) The address where the tow vehicle or vehicles shall be regularly garaged, the telephone number or numbers and the hours during which service is available at

- those numbers and the names, addresses and New York driver license numbers of all operators.
- (4) The location, size and security features of the storage lot or space in which towed vehicles will be stored, including the number of spaces available. The storage lot shall be designated either as.
 - a) "Inside building" a vehicle storage facility that is completely indoors, having one or more openings in the walls for storage and removal of vehicles that are secured by a locking device on each opening; or
 - b) "Outside secured" a vehicle storage facility that is not indoors and is secured by a fence, walls or other man-made barrier that is at least six feet high. The facility is to be lighted at night so that all vehicles may be plainly visible.
- (5) The name and address of the insurance carriers and the policy numbers of all insurance policies as required by § 140 of this chapter.
- (6) A certification that on-call towing and storage services will be available 24 hours per day, every day of the year.
- (7) A certification that the fees and procedures required by this chapter shall be complied with at all times.
- (8) A statement that the Chief of Police or his/her designee may at any reasonable time conduct an inspection of the towed vehicles or storage facility of any applicant or licensee for the purpose of determining compliance with this chapter. The Town of Carmel Police Department may have a Commercial Vehicle Safety Bureau Inspector from the New York State Department of Transportation inspect any tow truck at any time throughout the licensing period.
- (9) Such other information as the Town of Carmel Clerk or Chief of Police may reasonably prescribe.
- B. All cost for a tow operator's license shall be payable to the Town of Carmel Clerk upon approval of the applicants license. Said fee shall be established annually by resolution of the Carmel Town Board.

§140-5. Application review

- A. The Town of Carmel Clerk shall forward all complete applications to the Chief of Police, who shall conduct or cause to be conducted such investigation as he deems necessary to determine the truth and accuracy of the information contained in the application and whether the applicant meets the following minimum standards.
 - (1) Neither the applicant nor any tow vehicle operator has any criminal convictions or prior motor vehicle infractions which might adversely affect public safety or welfare.
 - (2) The applicant has the ability to respond to the scene in response to any request for assistance within 25 minutes after notification.
 - (3) The applicant can provide on-call towing services 24 hours per day, every day of the year.
 - (4) The tow trucks and equipment are in safe and sound condition and in compliance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations. All applicants must meet minimum standards of operator performance, including but not limited to standards concerning the adequacy of the applicant's equipment and storage facilities and availability.

- (5) The applicant owns or has a valid lease to a storage facility within three miles of the Town of Carmel, in an area legally zoned for such use, and such storage facility shall have a minimum of 20 spaces for passenger automobiles and will be either an inside building or outside secured facility as defined in § 140-2 A (4) above for storage of all vehicles towed or impounded.
- (6) The applicant is in compliance with and/or has the ability to comply with all other requirements and standards set forth herein.
- (7) Storage facility must meet local zoning requirements.
- B. In addition to the minimum standards of performance referred to in the preceding subsection, all applicants are subject to disqualification if found deficient in any one of the following areas.
 - (1) The applicant provided false or inaccurate information on the application form.
 - (2) The applicant lacks experience and/or does not have good references from prior customers of the applicant's towing and storage services.
- C. The Chief of Police shall endorse his/her approval or disapproval of the application within 30 days of receipt by him. If the application is disapproved, the reasons therefor shall be set forth in writing. The Town of Carmel Clerk shall notify the applicant in writing that the application has been granted or denied. If the application is denied, the reasons for such denial shall be set forth in the notice, along with the applicant's right to appeal the denial to the Town of Carmel Town Board pursuant to § 140-6.

§ 140-6. Issuance of license; renewal; display; transferability

- A. A tow operator's license shall be issued by the Town of Carmel Clerk to an approved applicant upon provision of insurance certification pursuant to § 140-7 and approval by the Chief of Police. The Town of Carmel Clerk shall send a copy of the license to the Police Department for filing and shall keep a permanent record of all licenses issued.
- B. All licenses issued under this chapter shall expire at the end of the calendar year in which issued. Applications for renewal, certifying any changes to the original application or certifying no change, shall be filed with the Clerk at least 30 days before expiration on forms provided by the Clerk. Renewal applications will be forwarded to the Chief of Police for review and any necessary investigation in accordance with the procedures and standards set forth in § 140-3. If approved, a renewal license shall be issued upon payment of the license fee and provision of required insurance certifications.
- C. All licenses issued under this chapter, or certified copies thereof, shall be displayed prominently on all tow vehicles and at the tow operator's principal place of business.
- D. All licenses issued under this chapter are nontransferable.

§ 140-7. Revocation and suspension

- A. Licenses issued under this chapter may be revoked by the Chief of Police after reasonable notice and hearing for any of the following reasons.
 - (1) False or materially inaccurate information in the application or a change of circumstances which would have caused disapproval of the application if existing at the time of approval.
 - (2) Failure to comply with any of the requirements of this chapter, any additional regulations promulgated by the Chief of Police or any state, federal or local law relating to motor vehicle operation or storage.

- (3) Unsatisfactory service which jeopardizes public safety. More than three unexcused failures to respond and/or valid complaints (as determined by the Chief of Police after investigation) within a twelve-month period shall be considered grounds for suspension and/or revocation.
- (4) For certain violations, the Department may elect to impose penalties. Below is a listing of violations and associated penalties.

- (5) The Chief of Police shall promulgate such rules, regulations and procedures, not inconsistent with this code, as may be reasonable and necessary to carry out the provisions of this code. Such changes to this code may be made at any time by the Police Department at their discretion and will require the tow operator to sign a written acknowledgement notification of the change. The Police Department will accept requests for rule changes from the tow operators and the public. All requests must be made in writing. The Chief of Police or designee will respond, in writing to each request. Failure to comply with applicable rules, regulations and procedures may be cause for suspension and or removal from the tow roster.
- B. Notice of suspension and/or revocation shall be in writing and shall include the reasons therefor and notice of the licensee's right to appeal to the Town of Carmel Town Board pursuant to § 140-6.

A. Any person aggrieved by the action of the Chief of Police or the Town of Carmel Clerk in the denial of an application for a license or in revocation thereof or in the suspension from the Town of Carmel's on-call towing list may appeal to the Town of Carmel Town Board by filing with the Clerk, within 14 days after notice of the action complained of has been mailed to such person's last known address, a written request for a hearing, setting forth fully the grounds for the appeal. The Town Board will set a time and place for a hearing on such appeal, and notice shall be served on or mailed to the applicant or licensee at least five days prior to the hearing. The Town Board's determination shall be made by resolution and shall become effective immediately.

§140-9. Insurance requirements

- A. Every licensee shall carry insurance as follows.
 - (1) Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, including completed operations coverage, personal injury liability coverage, broad form property damage liability coverage and contractual liability coverage insuring the agreements contained herein. The minimum limits of liability carried on such insurance shall be two million dollars (\$2,000,000) each occurrence.
 - (2) Workers' Compensation insurance with statutory coverage including employer's liability insurance with limits of liability of at least one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each employee.
 - (3) Automobile liability insurance for owned, non-owned and hired vehicle's. The minimum limit of liability carried on such insurance shall be one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per person and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per incident or each accident.
 - (4) Insurance companies utilized must be admitted to do business in New York and shall have a rating of (A) or better.
 - (5) Contractor agrees to furnish certificate(s) of the aforementioned insurance to the Town of Carmel upon execution of this agreement and, with respect to the renewals of the current insurance policies, at least thirty days in advance of each renewal date. Such certificate(s) shall, with respect to comprehensive general liability and auto liability insurance, name the Town of Carmel and the Town of Carmel Police Department as an additional insured and, with respect to all policies shall state that in the event of cancellation or material change, written notice shall be given to the Town of Carmel Police Department, 60 McAlpin Ave., Mahopac, NY 10541 at least (30) days in advance of such cancellation or change.
 - (6) The purchase of the insurance required or the furnishing of the aforesaid certificate(s) shall not be a satisfaction of Contractor's indemnification responsibilities to the Town of Carmel and the Town of Carmel Police Department.
- B. All licensees shall hold harmless and indemnify the Town of Carmel, its officers, employees and agents from any and all liability claims, losses or damage arising or alleged to arise from the performance of the towing services requested of or rendered by the licensee. The foregoing indemnification language shall be incorporated in the general comprehensive liability policy required.
- C. All insurance policies shall be written by insurance companies acceptable to the Town of Carmel and authorized to do business in the State of New York.

D. Any license issued under this chapter will be automatically revoked upon expiration or cancellation of the required insurance or material change in coverage which renders that coverage not in compliance with the aforementioned insurance requirements.

§ 140-10 On-call towing list.

- A. The Chief of Police shall maintain a list of those tow operators licensed by the Town of Carmel to respond to calls from the Town of Carmel Police Department. In order to be included on the on-call towing list, an applicant must meet all of the requirements of this chapter and shall enter into an agreement with the Town of Carmel for a term of one year, said agreement to be prepared by the Town of Carmel Attorney.
- B. Calls to tow operators on the on-call list shall be made on a nondiscriminatory rotating basis, pursuant to procedures established by the Chief of Police. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Chief of Police or his designee from calling a tow operator out of sequence or seeking the services of a tow operator not on the on-call list if the circumstances require specialized equipment or if the interests of public safety so require. If the tow operator selected does not respond to the scene within the 25 minutes after notification, the Chief of Police or his/her designee shall be permitted to summon the next available tow operator. When any unusual situation occurs which may be dangerous to the safety of the public, such as a spill of toxic material or other dangerous cargo, the Town of Carmel Police Department may select any qualified tow operator.
- C. The Town of Carmel Police Department reserves the right to call any tow service designated by the owner of a vehicle involved in an accident, or designated by the owner of a disabled vehicle.
- D. The fees to be charged for the towing and storage services of automobiles shall be as set forth in § 140-9. The Town of Carmel shall not be liable for the cost of any towing and/or storage services unless those services are performed on a municipal vehicle.
 - (1) Tow operators must accept cash payment and at least two major credit cards with at least one being a bank credit card. The only exceptions are that tow operators may charge cash only for impounds or abandoned vehicles with plates removed at their discretion. The tow operator must maintain an interbank charge card in its own name, in the form of a Merchant's Account with a qualified financial institution. Patrons will be given a reasonable amount of time to obtain cash/credit card during off hours prior to the vehicle being retained at the tow operator's location. Tow operators must be able to take credit card payment roadside. Questions as to what is reasonable, if there is a dispute, will be determined by the on-duty Police Supervisor. If the tow operator disagrees with the decision, they must still accept the decision at the time and submit the dispute in writing to the Chief of Police, within 72 hours of the incident.
- E. Inclusion on the on-call towing list shall be automatically revoked upon expiration or revocation of the tow operator's license. The Chief of Police may also suspend a licensed tow operator's inclusion on the on-call towing list for such period of time as he considers appropriate for violations of this chapter, after a hearing on such violations. Suspensions may be appealed pursuant to the procedures set forth in §140-6.

- F. The licensees will notify the owner of any vehicle, that the licensees has towed pursuant to this chapter when said vehicle has been on the Licensees lot in excess of thirty (30) days from the time at which it was originally towed.
- G. The Licensees may exercise any lien it may have on a towed vehicle pursuant to New York State Law except that.
 - (1) The Licensees shall release to the owner or operator of any towed vehicle, any and/or all essential (e.g. medication, eyeglasses, clothing) personal property contained within but not attached to such vehicle upon request by the owner or operator without regard to any lien, which the Licensees may have on said property pursuant to New York State Law.
- G. Abandoned vehicles will be towed at no charge to the Town of Carmel, and at the tow rates pursuant to § 140-9 of this chapter to the vehicles owner.
- H. The Licensees agrees to store any vehicle, which may be impounded by the Town of Carmel Police Department at no cost to the Town of Carmel, or the Town of Carmel Police Department. Storage fees may be charged for each calendar day to the owner and/or operator thereof. An impound fee will be collected by the Carmel Town Clerk. Said fee shall be established annually by resolution of the Carmel Town Board. The owner of the vehicle will pay the impound fee and receive a release from the Police Department before the car can be released. The owner of the vehicle will be instructed to bring the release to the tow operator in order to prove that the impound fee has been satisfied. This impound fee will not include vehicles that are considered abandoned.
- I. During snow emergencies, Town of Carmel Police Officers may direct the removal of vehicles. Tow trucks will be dispatched and tow the vehicle(s) assigned to them by the officer at the scene. Tow operators will not tow any vehicle that was not authorized first, by the officer.
 - (1) The Licensees shall release to the owner or operator of any towed vehicle, any and/or all essential (e.g. medication, eyeglasses, clothing) personal property contained within but not attached to such vehicle upon request by the owner or operator without regard to any lien, which the Licensees may have on said property pursuant to New York State Law.
 - (2) The Licensees shall provide at least one (1) tow truck for each snow emergency, unless otherwise instructed by the officer in charge at the scene. The officer in charge at the scene will decide if more or fewer tow trucks are needed for each snow emergency.
 - (3) It is understood by both parties that in the event of a snow emergency, tow trucks may be tied up handling said emergencies. In this event they will respond as soon as possible.
- J. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a motorist or motor vehicle owner from summoning a tow operator of his or her own choosing, except that any Town of Carmel police officer at the scene of an incident requiring towing services shall be responsible for making the final determination as to when towing shall take place and which tow operator shall be called.

- K. All vehicles towed at the request of the Town of Carmel Police Department must be removed to an approved storage facility unless the owner or operator of the vehicle specifically requests that it be towed to another destination. Any Town of Carmel police officer at the scene shall be responsible for making the final determination as to the towing destination.
- L. No vehicle shall be released by the tow operator until the owner or agent of the vehicle produces a release form from the Town of Carmel Police Department. No verbal releases are to be accepted. The Town of Carmel is not responsible for any costs, compensation or damage which a tow operator may suffer by the Town of Carmel agreeing for a vehicle to be released. Vehicles may only be retrieved during the normal working hours of the tow operator.
- M. Up to 20 vehicles towed at the request of the Town of Carmel Police Department must be stored together at the approved storage facility and not scattered throughout the premises.
- N. No tow operator shall dispose, destroy, remove, sell or otherwise transfer any vehicle towed at the request of the Town of Carmel Police Department without first complying with all applicable laws of the State of New York and notifying the Town of Carmel Police Department of its intention to do so, in writing, at least 14 days prior to effectuating the same.
- O. Upon request by the Town of Carmel Police Department, the tow operator shall store a motor vehicle in an inside building as defined in § 140-2 A (4). Vehicles designated by the police as being suspected of being used in criminal activity shall be stored in a separate space for the exclusive use of the Police Department and shall not be released without the written permission of the Chief of Police, Acting Chief of Police, Lieutenant or Sergeant.
- P. In addition to any requirements set forth elsewhere in this chapter, all approved towing services must provide, in writing, an employment nondiscrimination statement prior to the issuance of said approval and must agree to comply with all state and federal laws and regulations concerning wages, hours and terms of employment.
- Q. Employees of an approved towing service shall in no way be deemed to represent or be employed by this municipality, and all such towing services shall be responsible for the conduct of their employees.
- R. All towing and storage fees shall be disclosed in an appropriate notice on the front or top page of all invoices and receipts. Additionally, adequate public posting of such fees must be made at the storage area, in easy view of the public.

§ 140-11. Fee Schedule

- A. Establishment of a Fee schedule; restrictions.
 - (1) No person shall be liable to any tow operator who tows or stores an automobile which was damaged in an accident and recovered after being reported stolen, for any fees in excess of those fees as listed by the fee schedule, which shall be kept on file with the Chief of Police or his/her

designee, as well as by the Town of Carmel Clerk. Said fee shall be established annually by resolution of the Carmel Town Board, which shall change from time to time upon the consideration of any suggestions or recommendations of the Chief of Police according to changes to the prevailing rates for towing. Any changes in the fee schedule are hereby permitted to be done by resolution, which shall be passed by the Town of Carmel Town Board. The fee schedule shall include basic towing service fees, storage fees, and miscellaneous charges.

- (2) For all towing services other than those defined as basic towing and for all vehicles other than those defined as automobiles, the tow operator shall set reasonable and customary fees for the Town of Carmel area for the towing and storage of such vehicles. The tow operator shall submit annually as part of its application or renewal thereof its fee schedule for the towing and storage of all motor vehicles other than automobiles, which shall be subject to the review and approval of the Town of Carmel Town Board.
- (3) It shall be the responsibility of the tow operators to comply with all applicable Department of Insurance rules and fee regulations.
- (4) Ledgers, records, impound releases and bills shall be kept for all vehicles towed and shall be available to the Town of Carmel Police Department upon request. These records will be kept for a period of three (3) years.
- B. No person shall be liable to any tow operator for any other towing or storage services for any fees in excess of the Town of Carmel approved fee schedule.
- C. When basic towing services are rendered for any automobile, there shall be no additional charges other than those provided for in Subsection A above, including but not limited to flat bedding, service call, second tow truck/ or winching, cleanup costs and additional labor.
- D. Tow vehicles transporting multiple vehicles at one time may charge the applicable fee for each vehicle transported.
- E. Prior to hookup or flat bedding of a motor vehicle, the tow operator shall present a copy of its fee schedule to the owner or operator of the vehicle. The fee schedule shall also contain the name, address and telephone number of the tow operator and a statement of the hours when the motor vehicle may be claimed.
- F. Licensees must meet the requirements of all State Laws which pertain to towing services, which are now enacted or may be enacted during the life of this contract.
- G. Every tow truck shall display lettering on both sides of the vehicle that indicates the name or trade name of the towing service, the town/village/city and state in which the tow truck is customarily based, the business telephone number, and their DOT or ICC number. Said lettering shall contrast sharply in color with the background and be a minimum of two (2) inches in height.

- H. Contractors shall possess a tow truck having a manufacturer's G.V.W. of 10,000 lbs., with dual wheels and a four- (4) ton minimum winching capacity. "Tow truck" shall have the same meaning as Section 148-b of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. Each tow truck shall have.
 - (1) In the absence of having a ramp truck (flatbed), "Dolly" wheels (tires with legal tread reading), snatch blocks, chains and nylon straps for towing.
 - (2) Broom, shovel, and a container to place debris into once it has been picked up and such other items or materials as would be needed to fulfill this contract.
 - (3) Each tow truck shall also carry a supply of "Speedy Dry" and/or sand, which the Contractor will place upon fluids at an accident scene, or as otherwise directed. The Contractor shall be responsible for the clean-up and removal of "Speedy Dry" and/or sand at the scene.
- Clean up of the accident scene is the responsibility of the tow truck operator. Example, vehicle parts must be picked up and broken glass must be swept and removed from the scene and not just swept to the side of the road.

§ 140-12. Regulations and procedures

The Chief of Police shall promulgate such rules, regulations and procedures, not inconsistent with this chapter, as may be reasonable and necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter. Copies thereof shall be provided to all licensed tow operators and shall be made available to the public, along with copies of current fee schedules, during normal business hours. Failure to comply with applicable rules, regulations and procedures may be cause for revocation of a tow operator's license.

§ 140-13. Enforcement

The Chief of Police is hereby designated to enforce the provisions of this chapter and any applicable rules and regulations.

SECTION 4: HOME RULE

Nothing in this Local Law is intended, or shall be construed (a) to limit the home rule authority of the Town under State Law to limit the Town's discretion in setting fees and charges in connection with any applications requiring Town approval.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

At said Public Hearing, all interested persons shall be heard on the subject thereof. The Town Board will make every effort to assure that the Public Hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. Anyone requiring special assistance and/or reasonable accommodations should contact the Town Clerk.

Water Quality Update

As many of you know the water quality of the swimming area was an issue during the summer of 2017. In hopes of fixing the problem, water testing was conducted. While many things were tested for, the testing ultimately showed a high level of nutrients in the water that can be causing the blue-green algae blooms. The source of these nutrients can be many different factors (and was not clearly pointing to one issue) and because of this we are hoping to combat the water problem on various levels.

As a advisory board, we are working with the town to treat the water to the best of our ability. A few of us have attended a DEC/DOH seminar to learn more about what we can do. We have a treatment plan in progress and also lowered the water level in the Fall to try to stop the blooms from reoccurring this coming year. With the treatment plan we are hoping to curb the growth of blue-green algae this summer.

WE NEED YOUR HELP! We are asking community residents to please attend the community meeting on April 12 so we can better inform you of the health of Lake Casse. In addition, please be diligent about getting your septics pumped before they become overfilled, please be conscious of the amount of chemicals that you use on your lawns/gardens as that can become runoff that impacts the quality of the lake water and increases nutrient levels and remember to clean up your shore line property of any trash and debris.

It is important to note that we may have another bad summer. We have learned that many times this is a cyclical problem and can continue for a few summers. Again, we are really trying the best we can to stop that from happening. Please bear with us as we would love the water to be beautiful and the lake to be open the entire summer!

Important Information Regarding HAB (Harmful Algae Blooms) & How You Can Help!

FREQUENTLY ASKED.....

Q. What causes HABs? Harmful Algae Blooms (Blue-Green Algae)

A. HABs are likely triggered by a combination of water and environmental conditions that may include: excess nutrients (phosphorus and nitrogen), lots of sunlight, low-water or low-flow conditions, calm water, and warm temperatures. Depending on the weather and the characteristics of the lake, HABs may be short-lived (appearing and disappearing in hours) or long-lived (persisting for several weeks or more).

Q. Why are some lakes more susceptible to blooms?

A. Some lakes appear to be more likely than others to have frequent blooms. Excessive nutrients, particularly phosphorus, is probably the most important factor, but some lakes with relatively low nutrients still have blooms while some lakes with high nutrient levels don't have algal blooms. Preliminary results from studies conducted in New York and elsewhere suggest shallow lakes that repeatedly turn over during the summer, lakes with lower nitrogen to phosphorus ratios, and lakes with zebra mussels all may be more susceptible to HABs. Researchers continue to look at the characteristics of lakes with HABs in hopes of finding ways to minimize blooms.

Q. I own a small private lake. What can I do to prevent blooms?

A. HABs on the lake. Many of the nutrient inputs that can cause an algal bloom are associated with activities and sources outside of shorefront properties. Lake residents and lake associations should work together with local and county government agencies to identify sources of nutrients and strategies to reduce nutrient inputs to the lake. The amount of nutrients can be decreased by: limiting lawn fertilization, maintaining septic tanks, creating shoreline buffers, reducing erosion and stormwater runoff, and maintaining water movement. Many of these nutrient control strategies are discussed in Chapters 7 and 9 in Diet for a Small Lake and in the Preventing HABs Section on the Information about HABs page on the DEC's website.

Lawn Fertilizer (NYS Nutrient Runoff Law)

Look for the Zero!

Before buying lawn fertilizer, check the bag for a set of three numbers showing the percentage of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium. Buy a bag with a **"0"** in the middle.



Zero in the middle means phosphorus free and that means....

Zero pollution - Phosphorus is one of the leading causes of water pollution. Even if you live far from a water body, excess phosphorus from your lawn can wash off and pollute lakes and streams, harming fish and ruining boating and swimming. More than 100 water bodies in New York State cannot be used for drinking, fishing or swimming because they contain too much phosphorus.

Zero waste - Why pay for a chemical your lawn doesn't need? Generally, only newly established lawns or those with poor soil need phosphorus. Phosphorus applied to a lawn that doesn't need it won't be used and can cause water pollution.

Zero hassle - It's against the law to use phosphorus on lawns that don't need it. (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, article 17, title 21 and Agriculture and Markets Law § 146-g) Check local laws, too-some municipalities have stricter laws about selling and using lawn fertilizers.





An over-fertilized lawn can lead to a green lake! Excess phosphorus in water bodies can cause algae overgrowth, including <u>harmful algal blooms</u>, with serious impacts to the environment and public health.

When fertilizing your lawn...

Follow the requirements of the law. **DO NOT**:

- Use lawn fertilizer that contains phosphorus unless you are establishing a new lawn, or a soil test shows that your lawn does not have enough phosphorus.
- Apply any lawn fertilizer December 1 April 1.
- Apply fertilizer on sidewalks, driveways or other impervious surfaces. If fertilizer spills onto these surfaces, you MUST sweep it up to prevent it from washing into drains or waterways. Do not hose if off.
- Apply lawn fertilizer within 20 feet of any water body unless...
 - There is at least a 10-foot buffer of shrubs, trees or other plants between the area you are fertilizing and the water,
 - o or
 - Fertilizer can be applied no closer than 3 feet from the water using a device with a spreader guard, deflector shield or drop spreader.

What should I see at the store?

Retailers who sell fertilizer must display phosphorus-containing fertilizer separately from phosphorus-free fertilizers and post a sign near the display. A sample sign is available in the "Important Links" section on the right-hand side of this page.

The law applies to:

- Homeowners applying fertilizer themselves
- Landscapers and lawn care professionals
- Pesticide applicators
- Retailers, distributors and manufacturers of lawn fertilizers
- Fertilizer/pesticide combination products (sometimes called "weed and feeds") when these products contain over 0.67% phosphorus.
- Organic phosphorus fertilizer (such as bone meal).

Penalties:

- For an owner, owner's agent, or occupant of a household, the penalties are: issuance of a
 written warning with educational materials for a first violation; a fine of up to \$100 for a
 second violation; and fines up to \$250 for subsequent violations.
- The penalties for all others are: a fine up to \$500 for a first of violation; and fines up to \$1000 for subsequent offenses.

Get a Soil Test

If you think your lawn might need extra phosphorus, test your soil. Tests cost \$10-\$20. There are several options:

- Have testing done through your local Cornell Cooperative Extension office.
- Find a commercial laboratory that tests soil.
- Use a home test kit. These tests tend to be less accurate and do not come with fertilizer recommendations.

Dishwasher Detergent

The Nutrient Runoff Law also includes provisions regarding the sale of dishwasher detergent:

 The sale of newly stocked, phosphorus-containing dishwasher detergents for household use and commercial use is prohibited in NYS. From:

Based on recent discussions by the Town Board regarding the Carmel Water District 2 (CWD 2) Water Treatment Plant, the Engineering Department requests authorization to issue Requests for Proposal (RFP) to develop a Water Treatment Plant Facility Plan.

Facility Plans for water treatment plants are required by the Great Lakes Upper Mississippi River Board of State and Provincial Public Health and Environmental managers (10 State Standards). The purpose of the facility plan is to analyze and determine expansion and upgrade alternatives to the CWD 2 treatment plant. The facility plan will follow the Ten State Standards and will include an assessment of existing and future treatment options, budgetary costs and preliminary schedules to complete.

RFPs will be requested from consulting engineering firms identified by the Engineering News Record (ENR) as the top rated firms for water treatment design that have local offices.

As the work progresses, Insite Engineering, Surveying and Landscape Architecture, P.C. (Insite) will be issuing memos to share the findings with the Community Stakeholders. The information contained in the memos will then be incorporated into the draft and final reports.

Task 1 Assessment and Definition of the Service Area

1.1 Extents of Commercially Zoned Properties to be Included in Service Area

This study focuses on the Commercial and Commerce Business Park zoned high density developed area on Route 6 in the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York. The location of the proposed service is shown on the Proposed Service Area Map, Figure 1 attached hereto. The area has both existing commercial and residential development (a residential zone is surrounded by the commercial and commerce zones). The area also contains several vacant parcels. All but two of the developed parcels (Mahopac Village Center and Society Hill Condos) are currently served by subsurface sewage treatment systems (SSTS's). Mahopac Village Center and Society Hill Condos are served by separate surface discharging Wastewater Treatment Plants (WWTP's).

The proposed boundary of the service area is bordered to the east by residentially zoned property, to the south by the county border, to the west by Baldwin Place Road, and to the northwest by residentially zoned properties. A highpoint in Route 6 approximately 800' south of the intersection of Route 6 and Bucks Hollow Road creates a practical limit for the service area. The commercially zoned properties that have frontage on Route 6 to the south of the highpoint were included in the service area. Commercially zoned properties to the north of this high point either currently connect to the Mahopac Sewage Treatment Plant or could connect to the Mahopac Sewage Treatment Plant by gravity connection to the existing sewer infrastructure.

The boundary of the proposed service area is delineated on Figure 1 attached hereto. A total of 155 parcels are proposed to be included. These include 138 developed parcels and 17 undeveloped parcels.

The study area is located within the New York City East of Hudson (NYC EOH) Watershed. The proposed service area is located in both the Amawalk Reservoir Basin and the Muscoot Reservoir Basin. The NYC EOH watershed is an impaired watershed with a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) established for phosphorus. As phosphorus is the pollutant of concern, the proposed treatment options will address this pollutant.

1.2 Existing Sewer Service Areas

As previously discussed all but two of the developed properties within the proposed service area are served by onsite SSTS's. The existing flows on these parcels can vary greatly based on use and occupancy. The Mahopac Village Center is a commercial shopping center and is served by a surface discharging WWTP. Based on

the latest SPDES Permit (SPDES Permit #NY0090646) on file with the Putnam County Department of Health (PCDOH), the plant has a flow limit of 18,000 gallons per day (gpd) based on a 30-day average. The plant has a phosphorus limit of 1.0 mg/l per the SPDES Permit. The Society Hill Condo property is a residential condo development with a Homeowners Association managing common areas and utilities. The development is served by a surface discharging WWTP. Based on the latest SPDES Permit (SPDES Permit #NY0207365) on file with the PCDOH, the plant has a limit of 22,500 gallons per day (gpd) based on a thirty-day average. The SPDES Permit also indicates a phosphorus limit of 1.0 mg/l.

1.3 Review of Past Septic System Problems

Densely developed areas will typically see increased rates of SSTS failures and develop water quality issues. Space is limited for areas meeting ideal conditions for SSTS's including regulated separation distances to wells and other geographic features. When a SSTS fails, suitable land for conventional SSTS may not be available resulting in unconventional repairs that would not meet the requirements of new development. Land for conventional SSTS's for new development is also impacted by these same conditions.

A review of the soils in the proposed service area using the Web Soil Survey indicates that over 85% of the soils in the area are "Very Limited" in their ability to support a SSTS. The Web Soil Survey notes slopes, depth to bedrock, and depth to saturated zone for the reasons the soils have a very limited rating. SSTS's installed in these areas are anticipated to have poor performance and high maintenance.

Several factors impacting SSTS's in the project area as discussed below limit the areas ability to support the existing development and limit the potential for expansion and new development.

Small Lot Size – Many of the lots in the study area are less than 1 acre. Siting new SSTS's or providing code conforming repairs meeting current regulations on such small lots with individual wells and SSTS's is often not possible or practical.

Groundwater and Surface Water – Adequate soil depth below an SSTS is critical to a SSTS ability to effectively treat wastewater. Shallow groundwater limits the soil available to properly treat wastewater. For this reason, the PCDOH and NYCDEP require separation between the bottom of a SSTS trench and groundwater. Based on review of the web soil survey over 85% of the soil types in the proposed service area are subject to a shallow depth to saturation, meaning many existing systems probably do not meet the regulated separation.

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) Wetland F-26 is located in the southern portion of the proposed service area to the east of Miller Road. NYSDEC Wetland ML-11 is also located in the southern portion of the proposed service area between Route 6 and Baldwin Place Road. Small areas of surface water are associated with these wetlands. The New York State Department of Health and Department of Environmental Conservation does not allow SSTS absorption fields within 100' of surface water. The presence of wetlands also indicates the potential for a high-water table in the area. If high ground water is present, the existing SSTSs treatment characteristics are likely compromised.

Steep Slopes – Portions of the study area contain slopes in excess of 15%. SSTSs are not allowed on slopes in excess of 15% for single family residential SSTS's, or 20% for commercial SSTS's per PCDOH and New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYCDEP) regulations. In addition, placement of SSTSs on steep slopes can lead to SSTS failures.

Ledgerock – The shallow depth of ledgerock in some areas makes conventional SSTSs less effective in properly treating sewage effluent. It is probable that many SSTSs were not designed with this shallow depth in mind and are today considered substandard in the critical separation distance from absorption trench to ledgerock. Exposed ledgerock is evident on several parcels in the northern part of the service area.

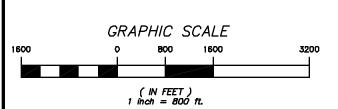
SSTS and Well Separation Distances – The early development of the study area occurred when SSTS and water well placement where not strictly regulated. Current PCDOH regulations require SSTS/well separations ranging from 100' to 200'. Due to the small lot size it can be deduced that many SSTSs in the area are located with significantly reduced horizontal separation distances from wells. The reduced separation has likely contributed to a decline in ground and surface water quality.

Commercial SSTS's Under Pavement / Parking – Locating commercial SSTS's under pavement was once allowed by regulations, but is currently prohibited by the NYCDEP for the service area. Locating SSTS's under pavement is not an ideal situation for the system and may lead to earlier failures then similar systems not under pavement. With the age of the systems, it is likely that SSTS under pavement exist in the proposed service area which would be considered substandard by today's regulations.

Age of Existing Facilities - The age of the existing SSTSs coupled with the previously mentioned constraints have led to substandard facilities in the study area, including SSTS failures.

These factors are impacting the water quality and sustainability of the area. SSTS's substandard in one or more of the areas identified above will lead to reduced surface water quality and groundwater quality. Suitable areas for installation of SSTS's for new development, expansion of development, or repair of existing systems is severely limited. These factors impact the areas ability to sustain the current level of development and potential expansion or new development. A centralized sewer system and WWTP provide a solution to these factors. By relieving the wastewater loads on the soils in the area water quality should improve. By making land available that is currently restricted by SSTS's, future development or expansion is more achievable.

The discussion above summarizes the need for a centralized wastewater treatment solution for the service area and how the boundary of the service area was shaped. Looking ahead to Task 2, the existing wastewater flows, potential wastewater flows from expansion of developed parcels and future wastewater flows for undeveloped parcels in the service area will be estimated.

- 5. Rumble strips on double yellow line on Croton Falls Rd in area of "S turns" McLaughlin Dr

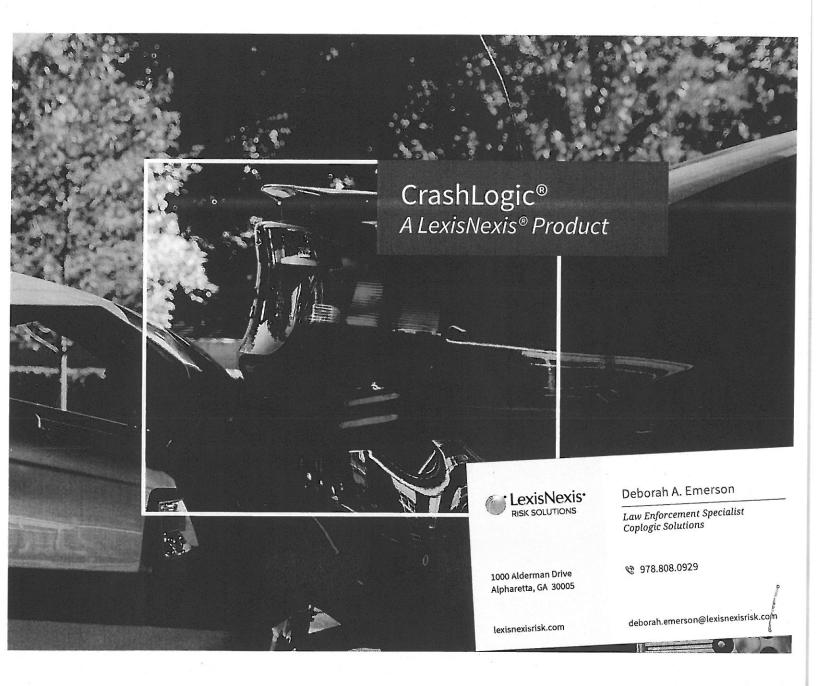

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LAW ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT

This Law Enforcement Agreement ("Agreement") is dated ______ ("Effective Date") by and between LexisNexis Claims Solutions Inc., on behalf of itself and its Affiliates with its principal place of business at 1000 Alderman Drive, Alpharetta, Georgia 30005 ("Provider"), and Carmel Police Department, with its principal place of operations at 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York 10541 ("Agency"). Provider and Agency may be referred to herein individually as a "Party" and collectively referred to as "Parties". "Affiliate" means any corporation, firm, partnership or other entity that directly or indirectly controls, or is controlled by, or is under common control with Provider.

1. SCOPE.

Provider as part of its business has developed several comprehensive products and services for law enforcement. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Agency desires to order and Provider agrees to provide the various products and services contained herein (collectively referred to as the "Services") as described in an applicable order to this Agreement ("Order"). The Parties acknowledge Agency is a law enforcement entity with responsibility for the documentation, retention, and management of information and reporting related to vehicle accidents, citations, and incidents occurring within its jurisdiction (as used within this Agreement, each documented event is a "Report"). "Report" shall also include any associated or supplemental information provided with the Report including Agency name, images and upload date, as applicable.

2. LICENSE AND RESTRICTIONS.

- 2.1 <u>License Grant and License Restrictions</u>. Upon execution of an applicable Order, Provider hereby grants to Agency a restricted, limited, revocable license to use the Services only as set forth in this Agreement and any applicable Order, and for no other purposes, subject to the restrictions and limitations set forth below:
 - a. Agency shall not use the Services for marketing or commercial solicitation purposes, resell, or broker the Services to any third-party or otherwise use the Services for any personal (non-law enforcement) purposes; and
 - b. Agency shall not access or use Services from outside the United States without Provider's prior written approval; and
 - c. Agency shall not use the Services to create a competing product or provide data processing services to third parties; and
 - d. Agency's use of the Services hereunder will not knowingly violate any agreements to which Agency is bound; and
 - e. Agency shall not harvest, post, transmit, copy, modify, create derivative works from, tamper, distribute the Services, or in any way circumvent the navigational structure of the Services, including to upload or transmit any computer viruses, Trojan Horses, worms or anything else designed to interfere with, interrupt or disrupt the normal operating procedures of Services; and
 - f. Agency may not use the Services to store or transmit infringing, libelous, or otherwise unlawful or tortuous material, or to store or transmit material in violation of third-party privacy rights or otherwise infringe on the rights of others; and
 - g. Agency shall not reveal any user accounts or passwords for the Services to any third parties (third parties shall not include Agency's employees who have a need to know such information); and
 - h. Agency shall not permit any third party (third parties shall not include Agency's employees who have a need to know such information) to view or use the Services, even if such third party is under contract to provide services to Agency; and
 - Agency shall comply with all laws, regulations, and rules which govern the use of the Services.
- 2.2 Other Restrictions. In addition Provider may, at any time, impose restrictions and/or prohibitions on the Agency's use of the Services, or certain data or no longer offer certain functionalities or features that may be the result of a modification in Provider policy, a modification of third-party agreements, a modification in industry standards, a Security Event (defined below), a change in law or regulation, or the interpretation thereof. Upon written notification by Provider of such restrictions, Agency agrees to comply with such restrictions or, in the event that Agency is unable to comply, it shall notify Provider in writing of its inability to comply within ten (10) days after receipt of Provider's written notification. In that event, either Party may immediately terminate this Agreement by providing written notice thereof to the other Party without such termination constituting a breach of this Agreement. Provider shall be Agency's designated preferred provider of such Services as are mutually agreed to and defined hereunder, related to the handling of Agency's Reports.
- 2.3 <u>Violation of License Terms and / or Restrictions</u>. Agency agrees that, if Provider determines or reasonably suspects that: (i) Agency is violating any license terms, restrictions, or other material provision of the Agreement; or (ii) Agency has

experienced a Security Event (as herein defined), Provider may, at its sole option, take immediate action up to and including, without further obligation or liability of any kind, terminating Agency's account and the license to use the Services.

3. RETENTION / DISTRIBUTION.

For all Services provided hereunder that involve Reports, Provider will maintain a copy of each Report for a period of no less than seven (7) years from the date of the Report. Provider will distribute Reports and/or specific data extracted from the Report to individuals or legal entities ("Authorized Requestors") and other authorized law enforcement entities ("Agency Requestors") in accordance with an applicable Order and all applicable laws and regulations.

4. SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE.

- 4.1. Ongoing Maintenance. Provider will, from time-to-time issue and/or provide maintenance including bug fixes, enhancements, new features, or new functionality that are generally made available to customers along with any corresponding changes to documentation ("Maintenance"). Maintenance does not include work to custom code, customized configurations, or to unauthorized modifications of the Services. Any Provider assistance beyond standard Maintenance will be billed at Provider's then current pricing schedule, as agreed upon in advance by the Parties. Additionally, upon Agency's written notice of new or revised legislation, statutes, or ordinances requiring any Services to be updated, Provider shall update or modify the Services or particular form consistent with such new regulation within a reasonable time.
- 4.2. Support Services. Provider will provide ongoing support services for problems, queries or requests for assistance ("Support") provided that all requests for Support must be made to Provider Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM ET to 8:00 PM ET at 1-888-949-3835. Provider will also provide limited after hours Support including the ability to leave a message and receive a call back the following business day or sooner, if critical. In order to provide Support, Agency will provide all information reasonably required by Provider to identify the issue, including: an Agency point of contact (familiar with the Services and issue), description of issue, screenshots, the impact, and assist in Provider's efforts to reproduce the problem (as applicable). Provider will work to resolve problem with reasonable promptness for issues that are application or Services related (Provider is not responsible for resolving issues caused by Agency hardware). The Agency agrees to provide Provider with data transfers, as requested, remote access to the Services system, and with sufficient test time on the Agency's computer system to duplicate the problem, to certify that the problem is with the Services, and to certify that the problem has been corrected. If the problem cannot readily be resolved, Provider will attempt to identify a work around. Upon resolution of any issue, Provider shall notify the Agency of such resolution via email. The Parties agree that Provider is not obligated to ensure that its Services are compatible with outdated (exceeding 4 years from date of initial release) hardware, computer operating services or database engines.
- 4.3. On Site Support. In response to written Agency requests for Provider to provide on-site routine non-emergency support, Provider shall produce a written estimate of the time required to provide the requested support and state any requirements, such as the presence of Agency staff or other resources or materials. Any on-site support provided by Provider shall only be invoiced by Provider or paid by Agency if the problem arose due to something other than a defect in the Services. The Agency shall reimburse Provider at the rate of two thousand five hundred (\$2,500.00) dollars per day for each Provider employee who provides any on-site support, and such fees will not include any reimbursement for Provider travel time or travel expenses.

5. FEES.

- 5.1. Fees due to Provider. Any fees due to Provider for Services hereunder shall be specified in an Order ("Fees"). For any Order where Fees are specified, Provider will issue an invoice to Agency pursuant to the terms in the Order. Invoices shall be paid in full by Agency within thirty (30) days from invoice date. Provider may increase or decrease the Fee following the Initial Term (as defined in an applicable Order) in an Order by providing Agency no less than sixty (60) days written notice prior to the effective date of such pricing change. In the event Agency has a good faith dispute on all or a portion of an unpaid invoice ("Dispute"), Agency shall notify Provider in writing and follow the procedures set forth below. To the extent an interface or other technological development is required to enable an Agency designated third party (i.e., RMS Vendor) to receive Reports from Provider at Agency's request or to enable Provider to intake Agency Data, such cost shall not be borne by Provider. If any invoice (or undisputed portion thereof) remains unpaid and not subject to a Dispute after sixty (60) days from the invoice date, Provider shall have the right to terminate this Agreement (including all Services) or the right to discontinue the applicable Service immediately, without such action constituting a breach or incurring any liability herein. All Fees not properly disputed or paid shall accrue interest at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum. All Fees are calculated for payment made via ACH, Wire, or Agency check. Agency agrees that Fees exclude taxes (if applicable) or other cost incurred by Agency's RMS Vendor or other third parties and agrees such costs shall be passed on to Agency. Provider shall not be required to enter into a third-party relationship to obtain payment for the Service provided to Agency; however, should Provider elect to do so, Provider reserves the right to charge Agency additional fees for such accommodation.
- 5.2. Fees due to Agency. All Reports requested by Agency Requestors shall be provided free of charge. Provider will collect a fee as set forth in an applicable Order ("Agency Fee(s)") on behalf of Agency for Report requests by an Authorized Requestor. Provider will remit any Agency Fees to Agency using the process as herein defined. For clarity, if a fee is not

- charged to an Authorized Requestor for the Report, no Agency Fee shall be collected or paid to Agency. In connection with this Section, on a monthly basis, Provider will electronically transfer to Agency's designated account, the total amount of applicable Agency Fees collected by Provider during the previous month. Provider will provide a monthly report to Agency identifying the number of Reports provided on its behalf.
- 5.3. <u>Fees retained by Provider</u>. Where permitted by law, Provider will charge a convenience fee for each Report provided to an Authorized Requestor ("Convenience Fee") which shall be retained by Provider. The Convenience Fee shall be established by Provider at its discretion, but in no event shall exceed the amount a provider may legally charge an Authorized Requestor.

6. TERMS AND TERMINATION.

- 6.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date and shall continue until terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Each Order shall set forth the specified term for the particular Service.
- 6.2. Termination.
 - 6.2.1. Either Party may terminate this Agreement or any Order for cause if the other Party breaches a material obligation under the terms of this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days of receiving written notice thereof from the non-breaching Party, provided, however, that if such material breach is of a nature that it cannot be cured, immediate termination shall be allowed. Failure to pay by either Party shall be considered a material default.
 - 6.2.2. Either Party may elect to terminate this Agreement or any Order by providing written notice to the other of such intent, at least ninety (90) days prior to the end of the applicable Order term.
 - 6.2.3. Provider may, upon six (6) months written notice to Agency, terminate any Service that will no longer be supported or offered by Provider. Provider will make reasonable efforts to transition Agency to a similar Service, if available. Further, Provider may at any time cease to provide Agency access to any portions of features of the Services thereof which Provider is no longer legally or contractually permitted to provide.
- 6.3. Effect of Termination. Upon termination of this Agreement, each Party shall be liable for payment to the other Party of all amounts due and payable for Services provided through the effective date of such termination. Upon receipt of Agency's written request after termination, Provider shall provide Agency with access to Reports provided by Agency under this Agreement and/or data provided through provision of the Services by Agency under an applicable Order so Agency may download and/or copy such information. Provider shall not be obligated to delete from its databases (or from other storage media) and/or return to Agency, Reports already provided to Provider by Agency, and shall be permitted to continue to maintain and distribute the Reports already in its possession to Authorized Requestors in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

7. RELEVANT LAWS.

Each Party shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations related to its performance hereunder, including:

- 7.1. <u>Driver's Privacy Protection Act</u>. Agency acknowledges that certain Services provided under this Agreement may include the provision of certain personal information from a motor vehicle record obtained by Provider from state Departments of Motor Vehicles as those terms are defined by the Federal Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 U.S.C. § 2721 et seq., ("DPPA") and its state analogues ("DMV Data"), and that Agency is required to comply with the DPPA or its state analogues, as applicable. Agency agrees that it may be required to certify its permissible use of DPPA or DMV Data at the time it requests information in connection with certain Services and will recertify upon request by Provider.
- 7.2. Fair Credit Reporting Act. The Services provided pursuant to this Agreement are not provided by "consumer reporting agencies" as that term is defined in the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. § 1681, et seq.) ("FCRA") and do not constitute "consumer reports" as that term is defined in the FCRA. Agency certifies that it will not use any of the information it receives through the Services in whole or in part as a factor in determining eligibility for credit, insurance, or employment or for any other eligibility purpose that would qualify the information in as a consumer report
- 7.3. Protected Health Information. Unless otherwise contemplated by an applicable Business Associate Agreement executed by the Parties, Agency will not provide Provider with any Protected Health Information (as that term is defined in 45 C.F.R. Sec. 160.103) or with Electronic Health Records or Patient Health Records (as those terms are defined in 42 U.S.C. Sec. 17921(5), and 42 U.S.C. Sec. 17921(11), respectively) or with information from such records without the execution of a separate agreement between the Parties.
- 7.4. <u>Social Security Numbers</u>. Social Security Numbers may be available hereunder as part of Reports and/or related data provided from certain states. However, Agency shall not provide Social Security Numbers to Provider under any circumstance under this Agreement. Should Agency require more information on Social Security Numbers or its obligations in relation thereto, Agency should contact Provider Agency Service at 1-866-215-2771 for assistance.

- 7.5. <u>Privacy Principles</u>. Agency shall comply with the "Provider Data Privacy Principles" available at http://www.lexisnexis.com/privacy/data-privacy-principles.aspx, as updated from time to time. Provider shall notify Agency in writing in the event that material changes are made to the Provider Data Privacy Principles.
- 7.6. Security. Agency agrees to protect against the misuse and/or unauthorized access of the Services provided to Agency in accordance with this Agreement and as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto.

8. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OWNERSHIP.

- 8.1. <u>Definition</u>. "Confidential Information" means all non-public information provided by the disclosing Party to the receiving Party hereunder, including, without limitation, the terms of this Agreement, all information related to technical, financial, strategies and related information, business information, computer programs, algorithms, know-how, processes, databases, systems, ideas, inventions (whether patentable or not), schematics, Trade Secrets (as defined by applicable law) and other information (whether written or oral). Confidential Information does not include Reports and information related thereto. Confidential Information does not include information that was, at the time of the disclosure: (a) or becomes (through no improper action or inaction by the recipient) generally known to the public; (b) lawfully disclosed to recipient by a third-party and received in good faith and without any duty of confidentiality by the recipient or the third-party; (c) in recipient's possession or known to it prior to receipt from discloser; or (d) independently developed by recipient; provided in each case that such forgoing information was not delivered to or obtained by recipient as a result of any breach of this Agreement.
- 8.2. <u>Treatment of Confidential Information</u>. Each Party agrees to protect the Confidential Information with the same degree of care it uses to protect its own confidential information of a similar nature, but not less than a reasonable standard of care and not to use the other Party's Confidential Information other than as necessary to perform its obligations or as permitted under this Agreement. A Party shall not remove or destroy any proprietary or confidential legends or markings placed upon or contained within any Confidential Information.
- 8.3. Intellectual Property Ownership. Each Party retains all right, title, and interest under applicable contractual, copyright and related laws to their respective Confidential Information, including the right to use such information for all purposes permissible by applicable laws, rules, and regulations. Provider retains all rights (other than the limited license granted herein), title, interest, ownership and all intellectual property rights in the Services including any improvements or modifications thereto, and Agency shall use such information consistent with such right, title and interest and notify Provider of any threatened or actual infringement thereof. Agency shall not remove or obscure any copyright or other notices from the Services or materials provided hereunder.
- 8.4. Exception for Subpoenas and Court Orders. A Party may disclose Confidential Information solely to the extent required by subpoena, court order or other governmental authority, provided that the receiving Party provides the disclosing Party prompt written notice of such subpoena, court order or other governmental authority so as to allow the disclosing Party an opportunity to obtain a protective order to prohibit or limit such disclosure at its sole cost and expense. Confidential Information disclosed pursuant to subpoena, court order or other governmental authority shall otherwise remain subject to the terms applicable to Confidential Information.
- 8.5. <u>Duration</u>. Each Party's obligations with respect to Confidential Information shall continue for the term of this Agreement and for a period of five (5) years after termination of this Agreement, provided however, that with respect to Trade Secrets, each Party's obligations shall continue for so long as such Confidential Information continues to constitute a Trade Secret.
- 8.6. <u>Return of Confidential Information</u>. Upon the written request of a Party (and except as otherwise specifically set forth in an applicable Order), each Party shall return or destroy (and certify such destruction in a signed writing) any of the other Party's Confidential Information unless retention of such information is required by law, regulation, court order, or other similar mandate.
- 8.7. <u>Injunctive Relief</u>. In the event of a breach or a threatened breach of the confidentiality or privacy provisions of this Agreement, the non-breaching Party may have no adequate remedy in monetary damages and, accordingly, may seek an injunction against the breaching Party.
- 8.8. Other. During the term of this Agreement and subject to approval by Agency, Agency agrees to serve as a reference for the Services, which may include (i) reference calls with mutually acceptable prospects; (ii) a published "success story" describing the partnership with Provider; (iii) the use of Agency's name in Provider marketing activities; or (iv) a favorable reference of Provider to an industry analyst or at an industry conference.

9. PROVIDER AUDIT RIGHTS.

Agency understands and agrees that, in order to ensure Agency's compliance with the Agreement, as well as with applicable laws, regulations and rules, Provider's obligations under its contracts with its data providers, and Provider's internal policies, Provider may conduct periodic reviews of Agency's use of the Services and may, upon reasonable notice, audit Agency's records, processes and procedures related to Agency's use, storage and disposal of the Services and information received therefrom. Agency agrees to cooperate fully with any and all audits and to respond to any such audit inquiry within ten (10) business days, unless an expedited response is required. Violations discovered in any review and/or audit by Provider will be subject to immediate action including, but not limited to, invoicing for any applicable Fees (if Services are based on number of users and Agency's use exceeds licenses granted), suspension or termination of the license to use the Services, legal action, and/or referral to federal or state regulatory agencies.

10. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES.

Agency represents and warrants to Provider that Agency is fully authorized to disclose Reports, information, and related data or images to Provider in accordance with this Agreement and to grant Provider the rights to provide the Services as described herein. Where redaction of Reports is required prior to provision to Provider, Agency represents and warrants it will redact applicable Reports consistent with all laws and regulations. In performing their respective obligations under this Agreement, each Party agrees to use any data and provide any services, in strict conformance with applicable laws and regulations, and further, to comply with all applicable binding orders of any court or regulatory entity and consistent with the terms of this Agreement.

11. LIMITATION OF WARRANTY.

For purposes of this section, "Provider" includes Provider and its Affiliates, subsidiaries, parent companies, and data providers. THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY PROVIDER ARE PROVIDED "AS IS" AND WITHOUT ANY WARRANTY, EXPRESS, IMPLIED, OR OTHERWISE, REGARDING ITS ACCURACY OR PERFORMANCE INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY IMPLIED WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, SUITABILITY, ORIGINALITY, OR OTHERWISE, OF ANY SERVICES, SYSTEMS, EQUIPMENT OR MATERIALS PROVIDED HEREUNDER.

12. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.

To the extent permitted by applicable law, Provider's entire liability for any claims(s) resulting from its acts or omissions, including, but not limited to negligence claims under this Agreement shall not exceed the total amount of Fees actually received by Provider from Agency (excluding pass through or out of pocket expenses) for the specific Services from which liability arises during the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the event first giving rise to such liability, and if not yet in the twelfth (12th) month of this Agreement, for the period leading up to such event. To the extent the relevant Services are made available at no cost to Agency, than in no event shall Provider's liability to Agency under this Agreement exceed One Hundred dollars (\$100.00) in the aggregate. This limitation of liability will not apply to any claims, actions, damages, liabilities or fines relating to or arising from Provider's gross negligence or willful misconduct. In no event shall Provider be liable for any indirect, special, incidental, or consequential damages in connection with this Agreement or the performance or failure to perform hereunder, even if advised of the possibility of such damages.

13. INDEMNIFICATION.

To the extent permitted under applicable law, each Party shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other Party, its Affiliates, and their officers, directors, employees, and Agents (the "Indemnified Parties") against and from any and all losses, liabilities, damages, actions, claims, demands, settlements, judgments, and any other expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), which are asserted against the Indemnified Parties by a third party, but only to the extent caused by (i) violation of law in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement by the indemnifying party, its Affiliates, or the officers, Agents or employees of such party (the "Indemnifying Parties"); (ii) the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnifying Parties during the term of this Agreement; (iii) violation, infringement or misappropriation of any U.S. patent, copyright, trade secret or other intellectual property right; or (iv) with respect to Agency, violation of any of the license terms or restrictions contained in this Agreement. The indemnities in this section are subject to the Indemnified Parties promptly notifying the Indemnifying Parties in writing of any claims or suits.

14. FORCE MAJEURE.

Neither Party will be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations hereunder due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to natural disaster, pandemic, casualty, act of God or public enemy, riot, terrorism, or governmental act; provided, however, that such Party will not have contributed in any way to such event. If the delay or failure continues beyond thirty (30) calendar days, either Party may terminate this Agreement or any impacted Order with no further liability, except that Agency will be obligated to pay Provider for the Services provided under this Agreement prior to the effective date of such termination.

15. NOTICES.

All notices, requests, demands or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing to the address set forth in the opening paragraph and shall be deemed to have been duly given: (i) on the date of service if served personally on the Party to whom notice is to be given; (ii) on the day after delivery to a commercial or postal overnight carrier service; or (iii) on the fifth day after mailing, if mailed to the Party to whom such notice is to be given, by first class mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid and properly addressed. Any Party hereto may change its address for the purpose of this section by giving the other Party timely, written notice of its new address in the manner set forth above.

16. MISCELLANEOUS.

16.1 Affiliates. Agency understands and agrees that certain Services furnished under this Agreement may actually be provided by one or more of Provider' Affiliates.

- 16.2 <u>Independent Contractor/No Agency</u>. Each Party acknowledges that it has no authority to bind or otherwise obligate the other Party.
- 16.3 <u>Assignment</u>. Neither Party shall assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other Party, and any such attempted assignment contrary to the foregoing shall be void. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an assignment by operation of law, as a result of a merger or consolidation of a Party, does not require the consent of the other Party. This Agreement will be binding upon the Parties' respective successors and assigns.
- 16.4 <u>Headings, Interpretation, and Severability</u>. The headings in this Agreement are inserted for reference only and are not intended to affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement. The language of this Agreement shall not be construed against either Party. Unless otherwise provided herein, any remedy will be cumulative to any other right or remedy available at law or in equity.
- 16.6 Survival. Sections 2-4, 7-12, and 15 shall survive the termination or rescission of this Agreement.
- 16.7 <u>Provider Shared Facilities</u>. Provider may utilize facilities located outside the United States to provide support or the Services under this Agreement, and if such centers are utilized they shall be under the control of Provider and subject to all Provider policies that govern data access, protection and transport in the United States.
- 16.8 Entire Agreement. EXHIBIT A - SECURITY AND NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Data Protection.
