The Police department is requesting permission to implement data sharing through our Records Management Software system vendor, ACS Impact Software Company. This tool will assist our officers and detectives in all facets of their investigations. We have a serious narcotics problem throughout the Hudson Valley region and the sharing of information across jurisdictions will help to enhance our enforcement efforts. I would like to have the ability to share police data with the 20 agencies located in Westchester County that utilize Impact Software. The Town of Carmel borders the Town of Yorktown and the Town of Somers and we are in close proximity to the City of Peekskill which all contributes to the twenty to twenty-five percentage of our misdemeanor and felony arrests being of Westchester County residents. Impact requires a signed agreement from the chiefs of all participating Impact users in the data sharing. I am asking that the Town of Carmel Town Board approve my signing of the data sharing agreement.

IMPACT Data Sharing Agreement

The purpose of this document is to define what functionality is included in the IMPACT Data Sharing technology and to be a vehicle for IMPACT clients to participate in the IMPACT Data Sharing Community.



Dear Supervisor Schmitt,

A town resident recently came to my office to inform the police of some traffic safety concerns that he did have. The complainant stated that he believes the intersection of Kennicut Hill Road and Mt. Hope Road is hazardous and suggested stop signs be installed on Kennicut Hill Road at that intersection making this a three-way stop sign controlled intersection.

After researching motor vehicle accident reports through our records department and visually inspecting the intersection, it is my opinion that a three-way stop sign is warranted in the requested location.

I found the following conditions to exist that warrant this opinion:

- 1. When entering Kennicut Hill Rd from Mt. Hope Road there is poor intersection sight distance.
- 2. There have been 22 reported motor vehicle accidents in that area since January 2010.

I also know that we budgeted \$18,000.00 for treatments and have received the quote for \$14,000.00 which leaves a remainder of \$4,000.00 (which is what is needed for the fence).

As the Board is aware, the referenced project was awarded to Pittsburgh Tank and Tower Maintenance Co., Inc. (PTT) to perform interior and exterior inspections of various Water District storage tanks.

PTT completed their studies and provided Draft report to the Engineering Department on May 31, 2014.

However, due to the severe weather conditions of this past winter, PTT was unable to complete the inspections during the initial mobilization period the week of March 17, 2014. The reason for this was that water at the top of the water tanks was frozen and the remote operated camera was not able to be placed in the tank by the inspection team.

PTT requested a change order in the amount of \$850.00 (attached) and, in the interest of completing the study in a timely manner, the Engineering Department allowed the work to be completed.

We recommend that the Board approve Change Order #1 and authorize the Supervisor to sign the same.

Severn Trent Environmental Services (STES), the operators for Carmel Sewer District #8 (CSD#8), has alerted the Engineering Department (Department) that the comminutor (sewage grinder) used at CSD #8 is not functioning.

The cost to repair the unit is estimated at \$10,433.75. STES requested and received the following quotes (attached) for replacing this unit:

JWC Muffin Monster \$18,159.00
 Franklin Miller \$19,603.00
 Grundfos \$20,250.00

It should be noted that the original unit was installed in August 2005 and has delivered almost 9 years of continuous service and that the repair of the unit exceeds 50% of the complete replacement cost.

STES also recommends that the sewage grinder control panel be replaced and changed to the 460V unit. The cost to change the electrical portion of this unit is estimated at \$760.00. A copy of Owens Electric quote is attached.

Therefore the overall cost to replace the unit, is \$18,959.00

This Department spoke with the Town of Carmel Comptroller and she indicated that there are not sufficient funds in budget for this work. (Attached), however, it is this Department's understanding that funding can be borrowed from Carmel Sewer District # 2 and paid back over time.

This is a potential compliance issue as the comminutor is not currently working and a blockage could occur, causing a raw wastewater overflow. The Town of Carmel would be in violation of our State Pollution Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Permit. This Department requests that the Town Board authorize the purchase of the comminutor and installation of the necessary electrical work outlined in the attached quotes, as an emergency installation.

This Department respectfully requests that this request be placed on the next Town Board work session.

Hello Richard,

Attached are the quotes for Sewer district #8 Drewville PS. It is my suggestion that the Grinder and control panel be replaced and changed to the 460V based on the rebuilt lower cutting system exceeds 50% of the complete replacement cost. The original unit was installed in August 2005 and has delivered almost 9 years of continuous service. The advantage of switching to the available 460 volt line will lessen the load on the 208V transformer and will keep the grinder independent from other control panels. Owens Electric said the 460V breaker panel has a spare breaker capable of handling the grinder and switching would be relatively simple.

Muffin Monster has the lowest price and Franklin Miller is second for replacement. Most of my experience has been with Muffin Monster and they are fairly dependable. I do not have any longevity knowledge of the Franklin Miller unit but they appear to be an equivalent unit. The only physical difference between the two is Franklin Miller unit is quoted with a fully submersible motor capable of running non submerged. The Muffin Monster is quoted with a manufacture exclusive immersible motor capable of being submerged for up to 7 days. My reasoning for not recommending the plain explosion proof motor is it cannot be submerged. When the station has had previous issues with either pump, generator or bubbler level system the high influent flow rate(feed from 3 pump stations) can cause exceptionally high levels very quickly, this causes the grinder to submerge for a short term with a strong possibility for motor failure.

My recommendation would be to stay with the Muffin Monster and immersible motor for this station. We could possibly try the Franklin Miller product at a location that is less critical in the future. If the decision is based solely on price the rebuilt lower unit is acceptable but you would still have a 9 year old motor, control panel, speed reducer, inline grinder housing that is powered through the 208V transformer.

Please approve this as quickly as possible it is a critical piece of equipment in preventing the possibility of pump and force main blockages. There is a 2-4 week lead time.


