# TOWN OF CARMEL PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #\_\_\_\_ OF THE YEAR 2010 A LOCAL LAW ELECTING A RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 105 OF THE 2010 LAWS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

SECTION 1. The following local law is hereby adopted as follows:

The purpose of this local law is to adopt a retirement incentive program for the employees of the Town of Carmel pursuant to Chapter 105 of the 2010 Laws of the State of New York. The Town Board hereby finds that it is in the interests of the Town of Carmel to adopt such a retirement incentive program.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CARMEL AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby elects to provide all of its eligible employees with a retirement incentive plan authorized by Chapter 105 of the 2010 Laws of the State of New York.
- 2. The commencement date of the retirement incentive program shall be September 1, 2010.
- 3. The open period during which employees may retire and receive the additional retirement benefits shall be 90 (ninety) days in length.
- 4. The actuarial present value of the additional retirement benefits payable pursuant to the provisions of this local law shall be paid as one lump sum, or in five annual installments. The amount of the annual payment shall be determined by the Actuary of the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System, and it shall be paid by the Town of Carmel for each employee who receives the retirement benefits payable under this local law.

SECTION 2. This Local Law shall take effect immediately in accordance with the law.

Councilman DiCarlo explained New York State's temporary retirement incentive program that will allow public employees to either retire without penalty at 55 years of age with a minimum of 25 years of service, or offer an additional one month of service credit for every year of credited service up to 36 months.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Jerry Ravnitzky commented in regard to the resolution authorizing the advertisement for bids for the installation of a photovoltaic cell system at Town Hall that he is pleased that the Town is moving in a "green" direction. Mr. Ravnitzky spoke regarding a recent municipal energy round table and the availability of grant funding.

Councilman DiCarlo asked Mr. Ravnitzky to provide a copy of the information distributed at the meeting to the Town Board.

Supervisor Schmitt noted that the Town of Carmel submitted grant applications to the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA). Discussion regarding the matter was held.

Peter Creegan referred to the resolution authorizing participation in the Hudson Valley Municipal Purchasing Group and inquired if Supervisor Schmitt networks with the County Executive in regard to group purchasing or grant applications.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that he networks with the other Town Supervisors in Putnam County and discussion ensued.

### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS**

Councilwoman McDonough addressed a concern from the previous Work Session regarding the New York City Department of Environmental Protection's purchase of property in the Town. She stated that contrary to what she had been told in the past, the Town Assessor has advised her that the property will remain on the tax rolls and that the City of New York pays 9.2 million dollars in taxes for its 5,171.48 acres in the Town.

Councilman DiCarlo commended the members of the Carmel Volunteer Fire Department for their recent 95<sup>th</sup> Annual Parade.

Councilman DiCarlo congratulated all elementary, middle and high school graduates from the Lakeland, Carmel and Mahopac school districts.

Councilman DiCarlo pointed out that construction activities have commenced at Putnam County's Park and Ride commuter lot on Mount Hope Road. He addressed complaints about early morning construction noise emanating from the site and the Town's efforts to assist the residents.

Councilman Lombardi urged the commercial businesses along Route 6 and Route 6N to keep their property refuse free and their lawns maintained.

Councilman Ravallo noted that lawns grow slower without pesticides and spoke about the benefits of not applying pesticides.

Councilman Lombardi expressed his support of the recent drug search at the Mahopac High School conducted by the Putnam County Sheriff's Department in conjunction with the Town of Carmel and the school's superintendent.

Councilman DiCarlo addressed the recent bomb scare hoax at the Mahopac High School. Discussion followed.

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS (CONTINUED)**

Robert Laga expressed his frustration with regard to the early morning and weekend construction noise from the site of Putnam County's Park and Ride commuter lot on Mount Hope Road. Discussion regarding the matter resumed. Disappointed

Supervisor Schmitt commended the efforts of the Lake Mahopac Garden Club for their annual flower show. He went on to announce that in the near future, the Town of Carmel and the Lake Mahopac Garden Club will cooperatively unveil a newly refurbished "Welcome to Mahopac" sign at the intersection of Croton Falls Road and Stebbins Road as well as a "Welcome to Mahopac Falls" sign at the intersection of Route 6N and Potter Road.

Supervisor Schmitt extended his appreciation to the volunteers who recently completed construction of the Muriel Cornish Pavilion at Camarda Park.

Supervisor Schmitt thanked the Greater Mahopac - Carmel Chamber of Commerce for their spring cleanup of the Mahopac Chamber Park in addition to their ongoing efforts to beautify the downtown Mahopac business district.

Supervisor Schmitt provided the schedule of the 2010 Town of Carmel Sunset Concert Series to be held at the Mahopac Chamber Park.

Supervisor Schmitt explained the Mahopac Public Library's program which provides free passes to its resident members for use at various area museums.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

All agenda items having been addressed, on motion by Councilman DiCarlo, seconded by Councilwoman McDonough, with all Town Board members present and in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m. to Executive Session to discuss a personnel matter.
