TOWN BOARD SPECIAL MEETING TOWN HALL, MAHOPAC, N.Y.

A Special Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Carmel was called to order by Supervisor Kenneth Schmitt on the 8th day of November 2017 at 7:13 p.m. at Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York. Members of the Town Board present by roll call were: Councilman Schneider, Councilman Lupinacci, Councilwoman McDonough and Supervisor Schmitt. Councilman Lombardi was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was observed prior to the start of official business. A moment of silence was held to honor those serving in the United States Armed Forces.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town Board had met at 6:30 p.m. in Executive Session with Engineering Consultant John Folchetti, P.E. with regard to a contractual matter.

CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC HEARING FROM 11/1/17 - PROPOSED LOCAL LAW AMENDING §156-76 OF THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF CARMEL, ENTITLED "WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT AND DEVICES" - HELD OPEN

Supervisor Schmitt reopened the Public Hearing from November 1, 2017 for public comment at 7:15 p.m. Twenty-five (25) people were in attendance.

Joan Lefurgy, 950 Route 6, Mahopac reiterated from the prior meeting, her extreme opposition to a cell tower proposed to be constructed a few feet from her commercial building/residential apartments. She distributed to the Town Board members copies of three articles, "Dangers of Living Near Cell Phone Towers Raised" East County Magazine (La Mesa, CA) dated November 2008, "Is Mobile Phone Tower Radiation a Health Hazard?" Hindustan Times (India) dated July 16, 2012 and "EM Watch Electromagnetic Radiation Health and Safety" (UK) undated. Ms. Lefurgy circulated a photograph which depicts the proximity of the proposed tower to a bedroom on her mixed-use property.

Councilman Lupinacci once again explained to Ms. Lefurgy that the purpose of the proposed Local Law is to regulate these devices and that projects that are underway would be an issue to address with the Planning Board.

Ms. Lefurgy stated that she is waiting for the matter to be addressed at a Planning Board meeting and had told Supervisor Schmitt at the last meeting that she would provide this information to the Town Board.

Geoff Smith, Mahopac resident cited his familiarity with Fairfield County legislation and stated that he has reviewed this proposed Local Law. He commented that he found it to be comprehensive and exactly what is presented everywhere else. Noting that he has over twenty years in the field of telecommunications, Mr. Smith offered his services to the Town Board free of charge to provide advice and answer questions. Mr. Smith went on to comment that provisions included in the proposed Local Law need to be enforced. He stated as an example that the screening on the site at a local funeral home should have been extended to the base of the deck.

Mr. Smith went on to comment with regard to the plans for the tower proposed next to Ms. Lefurgy's building that the beta sector is too close to a bedroom. He believed that if that was communicated to Verizon, they would be happy to move the site. Mr. Smith stated that if it is a Planning Board issue, he would join Ms. Lefurgy at that meeting.

Supervisor Schmitt stated that it is a Planning Board issue, and that the Town Planner and Town Engineer would also be involved.

Councilman Schneider asked Mr. Smith if he would provide a recommendation with regard to proximity requirements in the proposed Local Law.

Mr. Smith indicated that it was already included in the proposed Local Law and went on to caution that the carriers will attempt to take every advantage to increase their signal by dodging rules.

Councilwoman McDonough commented that efforts were made to include as much as possible in the proposed Local Law and pointed out the requirement for an applicant to provide a physical rendering of the project.

Mr. Smith stated that this was more in depth than he has seen. He added with regard to several large towers being constructed at this time that he hoped that the Town is retaining some of the rights to rent out space on them.

Councilman Schneider specified that it would be Putnam County.

At 7:24 p.m., with no one else present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, Supervisor Schmitt stated that the Public Hearing will remain open until at least the 21st of this month. At such time, he continued, the Town Board may close the Public Hearing, conduct a SEQR review, and then consider adopting the Local Law.

Supervisor Schmitt asked the Town Clerk to read the following Notice of Public Hearing as published in the Town's official newspapers:

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With no one objecting to the public notice as read, Supervisor Schmitt opened the Public Hearing for public comment at 7:26 p.m. Twenty-five (25) people were in attendance.

With no one present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, on motion by Councilwoman McDonough, seconded by Councilman Lupinacci, with all members of the Town Board present in agreement, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:27 p.m.

Supervisor Schmitt stated that the Town Board will vote to adopt the 2018 Annual Budget on November 15, 2017.

PUBLIC HEARING HELD - 2018 CONTRACTS FOR FIRE PROTECTION AND AMBULANCE SERVICES

Supervisor Schmitt asked the Town Clerk to read the following Notice of Public Hearing as published in the Town's official newspapers:

With no one objecting to the public notice as read, Supervisor Schmitt opened the Public Hearing for public comment at 7:29 p.m. Twenty-five (25) people were in attendance.

Jean Hopper, Mahopac resident inquired about the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department's proposed contract amount increase from \$1.2 million to \$1.4 million.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department requested a \$200,000 increase and that the Town Board will be voting on the 2018 Budget on November 15, 2017.

Ms. Hopper mentioned that the total amount for Town of Carmel's fire protection services will be over \$3 million and on behalf of the taxpayers, questioned if there was any other way that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department could raise those funds on their own in a different manner.

Councilman Schneider stated that they do have reserves. However, he referenced his familiarity with fire protection finances and pointed out that a department does not want to deplete their reserves too far. Councilman Schneider further pointed out that the theft at the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department resulted in an extremely large deficiency. He commented that when delivering fire protection and emergency medical services, it is imperative that first responders have the appropriate equipment. Councilman Schneider concluded that at this time he has not made the decision as to whether or not he will support the increase from \$1.2 million to \$1.4 million or an amount somewhere in between.

Ms. Hopper commented that for years the fire department's funding was approved without question and only now is being questioned because of issues that have come to light. She commented that there is division amid the community and how healing, respect on social media and transparency are needed in connection therewith.

Ms. Hopper agreed that quality fire protection is essential. However, she asked why the trucks were not purchased in previous years.

Councilwoman McDonough explained that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department has been purchasing vehicles as well as equipment. She noted that the two trucks scheduled to be replaced have completely exhausted their usefulness. Councilwoman McDonough also pointed out that their funding may be awarded up to a maximum of \$1.4 million and not necessarily the full amount. (Cont.)

Ms. Hopper asked for the operating budget of the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department.

Councilman Schneider stated that last year it was just under \$975,000.

Ms. Hopper asked if the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department's auditors maintained professional liability insurance.

Legal Counsel Gregory Folchetti explained that it is entirely possible, although the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department would be required to take any action against the professional(s) who prepared the audits.

Ms. Hopper recommended to the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department that they look into this. She commented that all avenues should be exhausted without shortchanging fire protection.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department does have a vehicle replacement policy and that there is no question that they need to replace two fire trucks and purchase bail-out kits.

Ms. Hopper asked in addition to taxpayers, where the fire department obtains their funding from.

Councilman Schneider stated that they receive monies from fundraising as well as from the State's 2% tax on premiums written for insurance which can only be used for the benefit of the general membership.

Ms. Hopper inquired if they could use fundraising money to purchase the trucks.

Councilman Schneider pointed out that the Town Board cannot control how the fire department utilizes their funds.

Councilman Lupinacci added that the fire department can if they so choose. However, he did not know if they have enough money to do so.

Warren Raab, Mahopac asked if the Town Board was provided a breakdown of what the contract funds will be used for. Mr. Raab commented that he did not have an issue with the funds requested and that he just questions how the money is going to be spent.

Supervisor Schmitt stated they did submit the information and it is available to the public.

Councilman Lupinacci stated for the record, that the Town Board has retained a fire department lawyer and that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department is required to submit all of their checks to him for audit. The lawyer's reports are also available to the public.

Councilman Schneider added that this has been beneficial for implementing changes and noted that the Mahopac Volunteer Fire Department has been very receptive to all of the recommendations put forward.

With no one else present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, on motion by Councilwoman McDonough, seconded by Councilman Lupinacci, with all members of the Town Board present in agreement, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:44 p.m.
