# The housing of chickens in the Town of Carmel is subject to the following conditions and requirements:

1. A coop for housing chickens and an attached run shall be permitted as an accessory use. The combined square footage of the coop/run area should allow at least four square feet for each chicken being kept in the area. Roosters are prohibited.

2. No coop or run for housing of chickens shall be located on a lot comprised of less than forty-thousand (40,000) square feet of lot area. A lot may only house a maximum of six chickens for every forty-thousand (40,000) square feet of lot area comprising such lot. No lot may house more than 18 (eighteen) chickens in total.

3. Coops and runs may not be located in any front yard as defined in this chapter. Coops and runs shall be situated completely in a side or rear yard, at least 15 feet from all rear and side property lines.

4. All coops and runs must be kept clean neat and free of debris and be in compliance with all state and local laws pertaining to animals generally.

5. All coops and any attached run shall be screened from view at ground level from adjacent lots by using 4 ft. to 6 ft. fencing, landscaping, or a combination thereof and the screening must be present throughout the year. i.e. evergreen landscaping.

All feed shall be kept in rodent-proof containers.

7. All chickens will be contained in coops and runs unless property size is in excess of three acres.

8. Penalties for offenses.

A. Any complaint received by the building department or police department pursuant to this chapter pertaining to the cleanliness or sanitary condition of the run/coop may be referred to the Putnam County SPCA for investigation and who is hereby empowered to enforce any and all violations of this code.

B. Any person or entity that shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a violation and shall be punished as follows:

(1) For a first offense: by a fine not to exceed \$50

(2) For a second offense: by a fine not to exceed \$100.

(3) For a third offense or any subsequent offenses: by a fine not to exceed \$200

or removal of chickens, coop, and run from said premises, or by both such fine and cessation of use.

(4) Each violation of any provision of this chapter and each week that each such

violation shall continue shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct offense.

(5) In addition to the above provided penalties and punishment, the Town

may also maintain an action or proceeding in a court of competent

jurisdiction to compel compliance with or to restrain by injunction any violation of this chapter.

By submitting this application and as a condition of receiving a permit, I agree that I will house chickens at the above address in accordance with all provisions set forth in §156-39.5 of the Town Code of the Town of Carmel.

## RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING, SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE AIRPORT PARK, IN AND FOR THE TOWN OF CARMEL PUTNAM COUNTY, NEW YORK, AT A MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$2,200,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,200,000 BONDS OF SAID TOWN TO PAY THE COST THEREOF - TABLED

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described is hereby determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the implementation of which as proposed, such regulations provide will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize such capital project and its financing;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The construction of improvements to and reconstruction of the Airport Park, in and for the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, including original furnishings, machinery, equipment, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$2,200,000, subject to permissive referendum.

<u>Section 2.</u> It is hereby determined that the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$2,200,000 bonds of said Town hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is fifteen years, pursuant to subdivision 19(c) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds herein authorized will exceed five years.

<u>Section 4.</u> The faith and credit of said Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Town, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

<u>Section 5.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor of said Town, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

(Cont.)

<u>Section 6.</u> All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of such Town. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 7.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 8.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 9.</u> Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said Town for such purpose, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law

Section 10. THIS RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM.

Ms. Mirra encouraged residents to visit the Putnam County Traffic Safety Board's Facebook page and website for engineering updates on the current Route 6 repaving project.
