Nicholas Fannin thanked the members of the Town Board for providing him with the opportunity to serve on the Environmental Conservation Board.

#### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS**

No member of the Town Board wished to comment at this time.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM**

Michael Barile spoke regarding a form letter that he received after the last major snowstorm and clarified that sidewalk maintenance is a property owner's responsibility.

Mr. Barile advocated for the enforcement of the Town of Carmel Town Code with regard to litter, noting certain businesses along Route 6 are not cleaning the trash surrounding their establishments.

Mr. Barile stated he was pleased with the provisional appointment of Michael Cazzari as Acting Chief of Police, mentioning that there were two excellent candidates under consideration. He went on to inquire about the status of the PBA contract negotiations.

Councilman Lupinacci stated that during the third session with a mediator, negotiations broke down and the PBA has filed an impasse for arbitration. The PBA is asking for 3.5% raises for four years. Councilman Lupinacci expressed his concern with the potential cost of legal fees for arbitration and his hope that with the new Chief of Police, a contract agreement could be obtained. A discussion ensued.

Mr. Barile implored the Town Board to reinstitute the Town of Carmel's Community Clean-up and Zoning Code Compliance Week.

Don Schipf inquired about the status of the Town of Carmel's other union contract negotiations.

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Councilman Lombardi stated that negotiations are continuing and that tactically, the other unions may be awaiting the outcome of the PBA union contract negotiations. Discussion followed.

Mr. Schipf inquired what type of arbitration was underway.

Councilman Lombardi stated that it was binding arbitration. He explained that when talks break down, the PBA and the Town present their demands to a panel of three arbitrators who will then draft the contract.

Mr. Schipf expressed his support of binding arbitration. Discussion was held.

#### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM**

Councilman Schneider announced that the Town of Carmel Department of Recreation and Parks will be holding their annual Easter Egg Hunt on April 5, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. at the Mahopac High School Practice Field. The rain date is April 6, 2014.

Councilman Lupinacci announced that "Freezin' for a Reason", a fundraising jump into the lake at Sycamore Park to raise monies for Cystic Fibrosis research, will be held on March 29, 2014. Activities commence at noon.

Councilman Lombardi announced that on April 10, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at the Mahopac Public Library, Greg Amato will be presenting a multi-media talk on the historic Hotels and Restaurants of Mahopac. The presentation is co-sponsored by the Town of Carmel Historical Society and the Mahopac Public Library.

Supervisor Schmitt congratulated the Carmel High School Varsity Cheerleading Team and their coaches for taking first place at the recent national cheerleading competition held in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. He stated that he would like to invite them to an upcoming meeting to honor them on their achievement.
