This chapter is adopted pursuant to the authority, of Article 2, §10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

### **SECTION 2: AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 137**

Article VI of Chapter 137 of the Town of Carmel Town Code entitled "Volunteer Fire Fighters and Ambulance Workers Exemption" is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following:

#### §137-14 Purpose

The purpose of this article is for the Town of Carmel to opt-in to the provisions of New York State Real Property Tax Law §466-a, as amended December 9, 2022 (Chapter 670 Section 1 Laws of 2022) and to provide a real property tax exemption on the assessed valuation of certain real property owned by an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, or to such enrolled member and spouse, as permitted by the Real Property Tax Law.

### § 137-15 Exemption Granted & Eligibility

An exemption from taxation of 10% of the assessed value of property owned by an eligible person as set forth below is hereby granted with respect to the Town, part-Town and special district charges exclusive of special assessment. Such exemption shall be granted to an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service residing in the Town of Carmel, provided that:

- A. The applicant resides in the Town of Carmel and the Town of Carmel is served by such incorporated volunteer fire company or fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service:
- B. The property is the primary residence of the applicant;
- C. The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided however, that in the event any portion of such property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
- D. The applicant has been certified by the authority having jurisdiction for the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service as an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or voluntary ambulance service for a period of at least five years. Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, State of New York as follows:

#### **SECTION 1: AUTHORITY**

This chapter is adopted pursuant to the authority, of Article 2, §10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

#### **SECTION 2: PURPOSE**

The purpose of this local law is to establish a temporary moratorium on the issuance of building permits and/or certificates of occupancy by the Town of Carmel Building Department for the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" within the limits of the Town of Carmel.

### **SECTION 3: LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS**

The Town Board of the Town of Carmel has received numerous complaints regarding the operation of "smoke shops" and "vape shops" as defined herein, specifically concerning their detrimental effects on the health, safety, welfare and quality of life of the residents and citizens of the Town of Carmel. The Town Board is currently engaged in a comprehensive review of its Zoning Chapter of the Town Code and consider the potential regulation of such "smoke shops" and "vape shops". In order to allow the Town Board time to complete its review, draft proposed new legislation and enact any such legislation for these types of establishments, the Town Board deems it in the best interest of the general health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town of Carmel to impose a moratorium on the issuance of any further building permits and/or certificates of occupancy by the Town of Carmel Building Department for the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" within the limits of the Town of Carmel which are not currently legally in existence or operation.

### **SECTION 4: MORATORIUM**

Chapter 156 of the Town Code of the Town of Carmel is hereby amended by the addition of a new subparagraph/section 156-39.6. which shall read as follows:

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no building permits and/or certificates of occupancy permitting the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" which are not currently in existence or operation at the time of the enactment of this law shall be issued by the Town of Carmel Building Department as a permitted retail use or other use within any zone within the Town of Carmel, from the effective date of this Local Law through and including June 30, 2023. For purposes of this section "smoke shop" or "vape shop" shall mean any business, facility or establishment with its main, primary or specialized purpose being the onpremises use and/or retail sale of tobacco and tobacco-related products, smoking equipment and/or electronic cigarette products and related products and paraphernalia.

### SECTION 5: HOME RULE

Nothing in this Local Law is intended, or shall be construed to limit the home rule authority of the Town under State Law to limit the Town's discretion in setting fees and charges in connection with any applications requiring Town approval.

### SECTION 6: SEVERABILITY

Supervisor Cazzari opened the Public Hearing for public comment at 7:04 p.m. Twelve (12) people were in attendance.

Kristin McConnell, Executive Director of The Prevention Council of Putnam located in the Town of Carmel, read the following statement:

"For those of you who may not be familiar, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) defines vaping as the act of inhaling and exhaling an aerosol or vapor made from a liquid or dry material that is heated in an electronic powered device, called an electronic cigarette, or e-cigarette. The liquid can contain flavoring, nicotine, or marijuana concentrates. Preventing vaping among youth is critical to ending the tobacco epidemic in this country.

The Surgeon General urges that youth use of nicotine in any form, including ecigarettes, is unsafe. Nicotine is a highly addictive drug and can harm adolescent brain development, particularly the parts of the brain responsible for attention, memory and learning. The Surgeon General also found that using nicotine in adolescence may increase risk of future addiction to other drugs. The potency of the nicotine in vape products vary, but there are nicotine concentrates that can be as potent as 50mg or 5% nicotine.

Most of us are already familiar with the information I've shared here tonight, but what may be new information is that despite the amazing educational campaigns and evidence based prevention programs in our schools, youth vape use is on the rise. According to the Monitoring the Future Survey, 20.5 percent of 10th graders and 27.3 percent of 12th graders reported using vapes in 2022. Additionally, we have emerging information about high potency nicotine product use resulting in seizure like disorders in children who have no prior symptoms, no risk factors and no family history of seizure disorders. These symptoms have been reported to us by our own school administrators here in Putnam.

The Prevention Council works collaboratively with local school districts in Putnam County. We constantly hear from school administrators who are overwhelmed with students' vaping at school. Another concerning trend we are seeing, is youth vaping high potency THC products, as well as Delta-8, Delta-9 and other synthetically-derived compounds that, just like THC, are addictive, intoxicating, and psychoactive. These dangerous products are marketed to youth using fun flavors, and sold in accessible locations like gas stations and delis.

Although you must be 21 to purchase vape products in NY, both local and national data shows us that children are gaining access to these products, and more so where there is higher density of vape retailers. (https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC8340854/)

The Prevention Council utilizes the environmental prevention strategies approach to prevention, which recognizes that there is constant interplay between the environment and the individual. Health behaviors, choices, and perceptions are all impacted by where we live and determine the level of risk individuals and communities experience. Strategies such as reducing access and availability of vape products harness the ability to shape an individual's behavior by structuring what is expected or permitted in specific environments in a positive way.

Youth vaping is a public health epidemic in this community and we all play a role in preventing the next generation of young people from ever trying vaping, and potentially saving thousands of lives in Putnam County. Thank you for making vaping prevention a priority."

Danielle Canora, stated that she is an owner of Park Ford in Mahopac as well as Hudson Valley Hemp located at 888 Route 6, and that she agreed that vaping and nicotine products should be regulated more. Ms. Canora stated that she was present at this Public Hearing to educate the public with regard to cannabis products.

Ms. Canora stated that her business (Hudson Valley Hemp) is not a smoke shop and that she is fully licensed by the State for hemp retail which she believes other retailers should be as well. She stated that she does not agree that smoke shops should be allowed to remain open from 10:00 a.m. until midnight, noting that she operates her business during regular hours. Ms. Canora stated that she caters to a clientele that ranges from 35 years old to 85 years old, and that she is constantly thanked by those clients who need her help with legal cannabis products. Ms. Canora invited everyone to visit her store and stated that should the municipality ever consider opting-in for dispensaries, she would volunteer to spearhead a committee in connection with the matter.

Ms. Canora stated that by definition, a smoke shop is a place that has nicotine tobacco products and smoking paraphernalia which she does not condone. She stated that she does condone cannabis health and wellness, notably for those people who want to replace prescription medications with a natural therapeutic.

With no one else present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, on motion by Councilman Baranowski and Councilman Lombardi, seconded by Councilwoman McDonough, with all members of the Town Board present and in agreement, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:11 p.m.

The purpose of this local law is to establish a temporary moratorium on the issuance of building permits and/or certificates of occupancy by the Town of Carmel Building Department for the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" within the limits of the Town of Carmel.

### **SECTION 3: LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS**

The Town Board of the Town of Carmel has received numerous complaints regarding the operation of "smoke shops" and "vape shops" as defined herein, specifically concerning their detrimental effects on the health, safety, welfare and quality of life of the residents and citizens of the Town of Carmel. The Town Board is currently engaged in a comprehensive review of its Zoning Chapter of the Town Code and consider the potential regulation of such "smoke shops" and "vape shops". In order to allow the Town Board time to complete its review, draft proposed new legislation and enact any such legislation for these types of establishments, the Town Board deems it in the best interest of the general health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town of Carmel to impose a moratorium on the issuance of any further building permits and/or certificates of occupancy by the Town of Carmel Building Department for the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" within the limits of the Town of Carmel which are not currently legally in existence or operation.

### **SECTION 4: MORATORIUM**

Chapter 156 of the Town Code of the Town of Carmel is hereby amended by the addition of a new subparagraph/section 156-39.6. which shall read as follows:

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no building permits and/or certificates of occupancy permitting the construction, establishment and/or operation of any additional or new "smoke shops" or "vape shops" which are not currently in existence or operation at the time of the enactment of this law shall be issued by the Town of Carmel Building Department as a permitted retail use or other use within any zone within the Town of Carmel, from the effective date of this Local Law through and including June 30, 2023. For purposes of this section "smoke shop" or "vape shop" shall mean any business, facility or establishment with its main, primary or specialized purpose being the on-premises use and/or retail sale of tobacco and tobacco-related products, smoking equipment and/or electronic cigarette products and related products and paraphernalia.

### **SECTION 5: HOME RULE**

Nothing in this Local Law is intended, or shall be construed to limit the home rule authority of the Town under State Law to limit the Town's discretion in setting fees and charges in connection with any applications requiring Town approval.

### **SECTION 6: SEVERABILITY**

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

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### **SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
