TOWN BOARD MEETING TOWN HALL, MAHOPAC, N.Y.

A Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Carmel was called to order by Supervisor Kenneth Schmitt on the 21st day of August 2019 at 7:10 p.m. at Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York. Members of the Town Board present by roll call were: Councilman Barile, Councilman Schneider, Councilwoman McDonough and Supervisor Schmitt. Councilman Lupinacci was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was observed prior to the start of official business. A moment of silence was held to honor those serving in the United States Armed Forces as well as for the men and woman who serve the community in law enforcement.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in Executive Session to conduct interviews for the position of Town Assessor.

Supervisor Schmitt apologized for the technical problems experienced in connection with the broadcast of recent board meetings. He stated that the glitches between the new video equipment at Town Hall and Comcast as well as Verizon are being addressed.

impacts.

Supervisor Schmitt opened the Public Hearing for public comment at 7:21 p.m. Approximately fifty (50) people were in attendance.

(Cont.)

Carmel Water District #2 resident John Butler stated that this past weekend while taking their dog for a walk in their neighborhood, his wife noticed another leak at the Everett Road water tank. Mr. Butler estimated that between 10,000 to 12,000 gallons of water were lost as a result of the leak. He expressed his support of the improvements and inquired if the contract for the proposed work has been awarded yet.

Legal Counsel Gregory Folchetti explained that it has not because the funding for the project needed to be in place first.

Mr. Butler asked if these costs qualify for grant funding.

Supervisor Schmitt replied that they do and stated that the costs are already included in the Town's current grant application.

Mr. Butler inquired when proposals will be solicited for the proposed work.

Town Engineer Richard J. Franzetti, P.E. stated that a request for proposal (RFP) will be going out on Monday.

Mr. Butler questioned if the fact that this expenditure is incurring before a grant is awarded poses an issue.

Councilman Schneider indicated that applicants are permitted to submit for grants relating to projects that have already commenced.

Mr. Butler asked if that would put the Town at a disadvantage with regard to the grant submission.

Councilman Schneider explained that it would not. However, he pointed out that if the Town had been issued a notice of violation, the application would score additional points towards a grant award.

Mr. Butler readdressed the issue at the water tank on Everett Road. He mentioned that the gate was unlocked at the time and inquired whose responsibly is it to ensure that the location remains secure.

Supervisor Schmitt stated that the water district's operation and maintenance contractor Inframark would be responsible.

Mr. Butler asked if there could be penalties assessed to the contractor as a result of the breach of security.

Legal Counsel Folchetti explained how there may be a way to do it if the Town Board is inclined to pursue it.

Supervisor Schmitt indicated that for future contract renewals, that will be considered.

Mr. Butler expressed his frustration with the contractor.

Councilwoman McDonough suggested that the contractor be requested to provide a weekly report to the Town and discussion ensued.

With no one else present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, on motion by Councilman Schneider, seconded by Councilman Barile, with all members of the Town Board present in agreement, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:33 p.m.

WHEREAS, said Order duly certified by the Town Clerk was duly published and posted as required by law; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held at the time and place set forth in said notice, at which all persons desiring to be heard were duly heard; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

ORDERED, by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Upon the evidence given at the aforesaid public hearing, it is hereby found and determined that it is in the public interest to make the increase and improvement of the facilities of Carmel Water District Nos. 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 13 and 14, in the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, consisting of the construction of improvements to the district water tank or shared water tank and related equipment and site improvements, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of \$25,315 to Carmel Water District No. 1, \$1,562,615 to Carmel Water District No. 2, \$282,538 to Carmel Water District No. 3, \$360,296 to Carmel Water District No. 8, \$17,684 to Carmel Water District No. 9, \$53,658 to Carmel Water District No. 10, \$35,221 to Carmel Water District No. 13, and \$391,063 to Carmel Water District No. 14.

CARMEL WATER DISTRICTS NOS. 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 13 AND 14 - ISSUANCE OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF CARMEL, PUTNAM COUNTY, NEW YORK AUTHORIZED TO PAY THE COST OF THE INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE FACILITIES - WATER TANKS AND RELATED EQUIPMENT - AGGREGATE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$2,728,390 - OFFERED AS PARAPHRASED AND PRE-FILED

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions heretofore duly had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Section 202-b of the Town Law, and more particularly an Order dated the date hereof, said Town Board has determined it to be in the public interest to improve the facilities of Carmel Water District Nos. relating to the increase and improvement of the facilities of Carmel Water Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 13 and 14 in the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, being in each such district, the construction of improvements to the district water tank or shared water tank and related equipment and site improvements, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at aggregate maximum estimated cost of an \$2,728,390; and

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described, as proposed, is hereby determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c)(2)of the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, which as such will not have any significant adverse impacts on the environment; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize such capital project and its financing; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of paying the cost of the increase and improvement of Carmel Water District Nos. 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 13 and 14, in the Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, consisting in each district of the construction of improvements to the district water tank or shared water tank and related equipment and site improvements, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of \$25,315 to Carmel Water District No. 1, \$1,562,615 to Carmel Water District No. 2, \$282,538 to Carmel Water District No. 3, \$360,296 to Carmel Water District No. 8, \$17,684 to Carmel Water District No. 9, \$53,658 to Carmel Water District No. 10, \$35,221 to Carmel Water District No. 13, and \$391,063 to Carmel Water District No. 14, there are hereby authorized to be issued aggregate \$2,728,390 bonds of said Town pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is \$2,728,390, which class of objects or purposes is hereby authorized at said maximum estimated cost, and that the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of the \$2,728,390 bonds of said Town authorized to be issued pursuant to this bond resolution.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is forty years pursuant to subdivision 1 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the serial bonds herein authorized will exceed five years.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Town of Carmel, Putnam County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from monies raised from said Carmel Water District Nos. 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 13 and 14 in the manner provided by law, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Town, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

<u>Section 5.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

(Cont.)

<u>Section 6.</u> The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of said Town, including, but not limited to, the power to sell said bonds to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the Supervisor shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 7. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue serial bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of such Town. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. The Supervisor is hereby further authorized, at his sole discretion, to execute a project finance and/or loan agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Department of Health and/or the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a bond, and/or note issue of said Town in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

<u>Section 9.</u> The power to issue and sell notes to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation pursuant to Section 169.00 of the Local Finance Law is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents as may be prescribed by said Supervisor consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 10</u>. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 11.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 12.</u> This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the same form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

David Nicholas of Lake Mahopac Properties, Inc. addressed the Town Board's authorization to commence litigation against Lake Mahopac Properties, Inc. He indicated that there seems to be a miscommunication because it was his understanding that his attorney had mailed a letter on July 16, 2019 that contained the agreed upon terms between the involved parties. Mr. Nicholas requested further time to resolve the issue. He maintained that an agreement is imminent and pursuing litigation would be costly to all.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that there have been several meetings held concerning the issue and at the conclusion of each meeting, the representatives from the Town as well as the American Legion left thinking that an agreement was finalized. He stated that the Town Board has no choice but to move forward with the litigation.

Legal Counsel Folchetti explained the Town's involvement with the private dispute, noting that it is an attempt to assist in facilitating the sewer main installation.

At the conclusion of discussion held regarding the matter, it was agreed that another meeting would be held on the following Friday at 11:30 a.m. in the Town Supervisor's office.

On behalf of the American Legion Post 1080, David Carrido expressed appreciation to the Town Board for their efforts to help resolve the issue as they have been without a working bathroom and forced to utilize portable toilets at their hall for over five years.

TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

No member of the Town Board wished to comment at this time.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM

John Butler recommended that grant funding be sought in connection with the impending \$13,000,000 distribution system upgrades planned for Carmel Water District #2 as there is \$350,000,000 available from New York State. Mr. Butler expressed his concern that since a notice of violation has not been issued, the Town may be out of the running with regard to the current grant application.

Councilman Schneider clarified that although a notice of violation would have added points to the application's scoring, it is still possible that grant funding may be awarded. Discussion ensued.

TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM

Supervisor Schmitt read a letter from a longtime Mahopac resident in support of the park being developed at Swan Cove and the municipal parking project in the downtown Mahopac business district. The resident commended the Town Board for their vision and tenacity.

Councilwoman McDonough announced that once again she will be hosting the annual Veterans Thanksgiving Dinner on November 16, 2019. Further information will be provided closer to the date of the event.

Councilwoman McDonough announced that the final Carmel Farmers' Market will be held on August 25, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Town Hall.

Supervisor Schmitt invited residents to support the Mahopac Falls Volunteer Fire Department at their annual open house to be held on September 8, 2019 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. It will feature fire safety activities, free refreshments, a New York Blood Center blood drive and more.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Department of Recreation and Parks' Fall Sunset Concert Series commences on September 7, 2019 at the Mahopac Chamber Park from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and will feature Chatterbox 5.
