CWD7 ~ Vineland Pump Station Well Failures

On June 29, 2020, Bee and Jay, the operator for the CWD 7 alerted the Engineering Department that due to the June 28, 2020 storm, well pumps #2, #3 and #4 failed due to lightning and power surges. Below are the invoices to replace the pumps. These invoices have been submitted to insurance for reimbursement.

Invoice #95049 – Well #3 - \$13,474 Invoice #95050 – Well #4 - \$ 8,075 Invoice #95051 – Well #2 - \$10,400

PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

John Butler prefaced his questions by stating that they should not be taken as a reflection on the individual involved. He then asked why the salary adjustment for the Town Engineer was being made at this time, not during the budget process, and how the increase of about 11.5% was established. Mr. Butler commented that the action appears counterintuitive during these difficult economic times.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that shortly after the 2020 Budget was adopted, the Town's consulting engineer, at a cost of \$120,000, resigned. He stated that since January 1, 2020, the Town Engineer has been doing a great job running the department on his own. The Town Engineer approached the Town Board with a compensation analysis about a month ago which documented that he was undercompensated for his responsibilities by quite a bit and the Town Board agreed. A brief discussion ensued.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM

Rob Cavallaro, Walton Drive resident, spoke in protest of the proposed construction of a 140-foot monopole 5G cell tower on Maple Hill Estates property. Mr. Cavallaro stated that other potential sites were denied due to public outcry and legal proceedings, and that the biggest difference between putting a cell tower directly in front of his home and the other two locations, is that those neighborhoods had a voice. He stated that the Town of Carmel did not notify the residents of his community and that only a handful of residents on Walton Drive received a letter stating that the cell tower was going up as a result of an out-of-court settlement.

Mr. Cavallaro commented that the Maple Hill Estates property owners voted to gain profits at his community's expense and of the three proposed sites for the cell tower on the Maple Hill Estates property, they thought that the best spot would be in front of the homes on Walton Drive. He further commented that if Maple Hill Estates residents want this cell tower, then it should be placed directly in the middle of their 80 homes.

Mr. Cavallaro maintained that the Town of Carmel was negligent in performing their due diligence before settling this matter and spoke about how cell towers do not belong in residential neighborhoods. He stated that long-time homeowners were specifically told when they purchased their homes that no additional building would be permitted on the property where the cell tower is proposed.

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Mr. Cavallaro pointed out that many trees that Homeland Towers will be removing have an abundance of nests for birds of prey. He further pointed out that there is no turnaround at the end of Walton Drive and questioned how large construction trucks will safely navigate such a large operation on such a tiny street.

Mr. Cavallaro stated that homes are being listed for sale on Walton Drive. Potential buyers are offering significantly lower offers than fair market value due to the cell tower while other potential buyers are walking away from deals when they find out that a cell tower is forthcoming. Mr. Cavallaro demanded immediate resolve to this issue as construction companies are anticipating that the project will commence in September.

Jason Gandolfo, Todd McCormack, Dr. Denise Sepe, John Gandolfo, Jessica Gandolfo, Linda Shaw, Gerard Hanrahan, Patricia Gandolfo, Rebecca Bierhoff, Jean Hopper, Eileen Paganelli and Lou Paganelli also spoke against the proposed cell tower, echoing many of Mr. Cavallo's frustrations and expressing concerns related to health risks associated with cell towers.

Supervisor Schmitt assured the residents that he would be discussing the possibility of moving the location of the cell tower with Homeland Towers and would pursue the Town's legal options to make that happen.

ADJOURNMENT

All agenda items having been addressed, on motion by Councilman Lombardi, seconded by Councilman Schanil, with all Town Board members present and in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m. to the scheduled Work Session.
