A Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Carmel was called to order by Supervisor Kenneth Schmitt on the 23rd day of September, 2020 at 7:04 p.m. at Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York. Members of the Town Board present by roll call were: Councilman Schanil, Councilman Barile, Councilman Lombardi, Councilwoman McDonough and Supervisor Schmitt.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was observed prior to the start of official business. A moment of silence was held to honor those serving in the United States Armed Forces and the veterans who have served in the past.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town Board met in Executive Session at 6:30 p.m. for a litigation update from Legal Counsel Gregory Folchetti, Esq. and Joseph Charbonneau, Esq. with respect to Homeland Towers' proposed cell tower in Maple Hill Estates.

Supervisor Schmitt opened the Public Hearing for public comment at 7:09 p.m. Eight people were in attendance.

Supervisor Schmitt stated that although they are not present at the meeting, five or six residents from the Mahopac Hills area contacted him to express their concerns if oneway travel is created exiting Rockledge Place on to West Lake Boulevard because of limited sight visibility due to a curve in the roadway. He stated that these residents recommend reversing the proposed direction of the one-way travel.

Highway Superintendent Michael Simone explained that both directions were considered by the Highway Department and since only three homes would be impacted, it was decided that the direction proposed in the Local Law is the better alternative. Anyone else could exit through Vista Terrace or Sycamore Terrace which have plenty of visibility. Mr. Simone stated that he is aware of the turn in the roadway, however suggested that it may be the vegetation that is actually blocking visibility. He stated that if necessary, the Highway Department could cut down the vegetation or ask the occupant to take it down which would allow for greater than 150 feet of visibility.

Supervisor Schmitt inquired if there is a stone wall located near the vegetation.

Mr. Simone replied that there is. However, he noted that the wall is low, less than 2.5 feet.

Councilman Lombardi asked Mr. Simone if he had spoken with any of the residents.

Mr. Simone replied that he did not.

Councilman Barile indicated that it appears to him that the homeowner on the corner may be utilizing the very well-kept vegetation as privacy screening.

Supervisor Schmitt agreed and pointed out that the homeowner may not be willing to cut the shrubbery.

Mr. Simone reiterated that there are two other exits out of the area. He maintained that usually only the people who live there exit at that location.

With no one else present wishing to be heard on the subject of the Public Hearing, on motion by Councilwoman McDonough, seconded by Councilman Lombardi, with all members of the Town Board present in agreement, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:14 p.m.

Mr. Simone inquired about the status of his recommendation to the Town Board for an amendment to the "Vehicle and Traffic" Chapter of the Town Code regarding Cherry Lane in downtown Mahopac.

Supervisor Schmitt reported that Link Land Surveying was notified today to proceed with surveying the property. Discussion ensued regarding the downtown Mahopac revitalization project.

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #___ OF THE YEAR 2020 A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 147 OF THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF CARMEL, ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC"

SECTION 1.

This Local Law shall be known as 2020 Amendments to Chapter 147 entitled "Vehicles and Traffic".

SECTION 2.

Chapter 147 of the Town Code of the Town of Carmel, §147-51, Schedule X: Parking Prohibited at All Times is hereby amended to add the following street/road locations set forth herein:

In accordance with the provision of §147-19, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

Route 6	Both Sides	Between East Lake Boulevard and McMahon Place

SECTION 3. HOME RULE

Nothing in this Local Law is intended, or shall be construed to limit the home rule authority of the Town under State Law to limit the Town's discretion in setting fees and charges in connection with any applications requiring Town approval.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
