This memorandum is being presented to the Town Board to advise the Board of emergency invoices that were submitted for payment/authorization to proceed in excess of \$10,000.00 for services rendered. The following provides a brief a summary of the work that was performed.

Carmel Water District 6 – Shell Valley Pump #1 Replacement

On July 25, 2021, Bee and Jay, the operators for CWD 4, notified the Engineering Department that the pump failed out due to a lightning storm. The submersible pump, cable and related parts were replaced and set new on 8/5/21. Attached is an invoice in the amount of \$10,733.00 for Bee and Jay to make this repair.

Please note that this invoice has been submitted to insurance for reimbursement.

Carmel Sewer District 2 Repair for 2<sup>nd</sup> Stage Clarifier Drive on Tank 1

On August 6, 2021 Inframark, the operators for CSD 2, notified the Engineering Department of the failure of the secondary clarifier drive. The emergency repair has been authorized by the Engineering Department. In the event that sludge builds heavily in this clarifier, it can bring us to a non-compliance situation. Attached is an estimated invoice in the amount of \$29,442.61 from G.M.H Associates to make this repair.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM**

Jean Hopper acknowledged Senator Harckham, Assemblyman Byrne and Councilman Schanil for their efforts in obtaining grant funding. Ms. Hopper went on to address the Town Board's recent authorization to purchase a new police patrol boat for Lake Mahopac. She asked if anyone had reached out to either of the two Putnam County Legislators who represent the residents that live around the lake to request that they hold off on their vote to remove the Putnam County Sheriff's Department's patrol boat from Lake Mahopac until next year when the Town of Carmel will have a new boat in place to allow the continued coverage of the lake by two boats.

Councilman Lombardi clarified that the Putnam County Sheriff's Department and the Town of Carmel Police Department alternated weekends in the patrol of Lake Mahopac unless it was a busy holiday weekend. Only then would two boats be patrolling the lake at the same time. Discussion ensued.

Ms. Hopper addressed the recently authorized agreement with Villa Barone Hilltop Manor, Inc. for the provision of traffic control by the Town of Carmel Police Department and inquired whose Workers' Compensation Insurance would be applied in the event of an injury to a police officer while providing this service.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that a police officer sustaining a line-of-duty injury would receive benefits under the Town's policy as a §207-c claim. He pointed out that pursuant to the agreement, a portion of the payment paid to the Town by Villa Barone Hilltop Manor, Inc. covers the cost of the related Workers' Compensation Insurance. A discussion followed.

Ms. Hopper questioned the status of the repairs to the Town's current police boat.

Supervisor Schmitt indicated that a new motor was installed in the police boat last week and a minor repair was made to the gas tank.

Ms. Hopper confirmed with the Town Board that the reason the new police boat was ordered from a company located in the state of Washington was because the purchase was made under federal contract and a short discussion was held.

#### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM**

Councilman Lombardi announced that once again a donation box to benefit the St. John's Food Pantry has been placed in the Town Hall lobby for the collection of school supplies to help Putnam County families in need.

Councilman Lombardi announced that the second annual Prayer Walk to Honor First Responders will be held on September 26, 2021 in recognition of their service to the community throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. Sign in begins at 12:00 p.m. at the Veterans Monument on East Lake Boulevard in Mahopac and the walk follows at 1:00 p.m.

Councilman Schanil briefly reported on the ongoing water main lining project in Carmel Water District #2. He then wished all students, teachers, and administrators well as they return to school tomorrow and assured the residents in the area of the project that school busses will not be impeded by the construction work.

Supervisor Schmitt urged vehicle operators to drive carefully now that school will be back in session, and to pay particular attention to busses when their red lights are flashing and their stop arms are extended.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that he has begun working on his 2022 Tentative Budget and outlined the budget preparation process. He noted that the Town Board is required by law to adopt their annual budget by November 20<sup>th</sup>.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town Board will meet next at their Work Session to be held on September 8, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

All agenda items having been addressed, on motion by Councilwoman McDonough, seconded by Councilman Schanil and Councilman Lombardi, with all Town Board members present and in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 7:46 p.m.
