NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear M. Rivera:

An inspection of the above referenced property by the Town of Carmel Wetlands Inspector on May 26, 2021 revealed that the work being performed on site is in violation of the Carmel Town Code and New York State Environmental Conservation Law. The specific violations are enumerated below. You are hereby directed to cease and desist any and all operations at this location. This includes any entity or persons that are operating as your agent/contractor. This prohibition shall not apply to any activity necessary to protect life or safety of any persons or property. You are also directed to immediately install all necessary erosion control measures including but not limited to silt fence. Please refer to the most recent version of "New York Guidelines for Urban Erosion and Sediment Control."

SPECIFIC VIOLATIONS:

1. Town of Carmel Code §89-4 Wetlands – General Regulations (B) (2)

"None of the activities set forth below shall be commenced or carried out in or within 100 feet of any wetland, body of water, watercourse or intermittent stream or adjacent area within the Town of Carmel until, except as provided herein, a permit or letter of permission has been duly issued in accordance with the procedures set forth in this chapter:

(2) Constructing or permitting to be constructed any building or structure or part thereof of any kind, including roads and dwellings.

The penalties for this offense are as follows:

"Any person who violates, disobeys or disregards any provision of this chapter, including any provision of any permit issued pursuant to this chapter, or any rule or regulation adopted by the ECB pursuant to this chapter, shall be liable to the people of the Town of

Carmel for a civil penalty not to exceed an amount to be established by the Town Board for every such violation, to be assessed, following a hearing or opportunity to be heard in Town Court upon due notice and with rights to the specification of the charges and representation by counsel. Constructing or permitting to be constructed any building or structure or part thereof of any kind, including roads and dwellings.

Such civil penalty may be released or compromised by the Town Attorney with the consent of the Town Board and such penalty may be released or compromised and any action commenced to recover the same may be settled and discontinued by the Town Attorney with the consent of the Town Board.

In addition, the Court shall have the power to direct the violator to restore the affected freshwater wetland to its condition prior to the violation, insofar as that is possible, within a reasonable time and under the supervision of the ECB. Any such order of the Court shall be enforceable in an action brought by the Town Attorney at the request of the Town Board and in the name of the Town of Carmel in any court of competent jurisdiction.

The ECB shall require an application for a permit be made and conditions for a permit be met for activities which were conducted without an appropriate permit or may require an application and a permit for the restoration of the violated regulated area. Any civil penalty or order issued by the court pursuant to this subdivision shall be reviewable in a proceeding pursuant to Article 78 of the State Civil Practice Law and Rules.

Any person who violates an order, permit, rule, or regulation of the agency regulating freshwater wetlands and adjacent areas pursuant to this chapter shall, following a hearing or opportunity to be heard in any court of competent jurisdiction, upon due notice and with rights to the specifications of the charges and representation by counsel, in addition for the first offense, be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of not more than \$250 per day; for a second and each subsequent offense he or she shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$2,000 or a term of imprisonment of not less than 15 days nor more than six months, or both." (Town of Carmel Code §89-17).

Remedial work for this must be identified on a plan which you will have to submit to the Town of Carmel. Please contact this office to acknowledge receipt of this letter and set up a plan to remedy the noticed violation.
