§ 128-47.1. Street construction specifications for roads to be dedicated to the Town through a road improvement district.

[Added 10-6-1999 by L.L. No. 4-1999]

Roads which are to be dedicated to the Town of Carmel through a road improvement district shall be improved to the following standards as part of the dedication process:

- A. Minimum width of traveled way shall be 18 feet. Culs-de-sac will be 90 feet in diameter unless documentation is received from the applicable school district indicating that they will not be providing bus service on the road offered for dedication. In that case, the cul-de-sac may be reduced in size or eliminated as determined by the Town Engineer and the Highway Superintendent.
- B. Width of the right-of-way shall be 50 feet. Widths less than 50 feet will be considered on a case-by-case basis and upon approval of the State Commissioner of Transportation except that in no case shall the width of right-of-way be less than 25 feet.
- C. The road surface and base shall meet the following standards:
 - (1) Top course: two inches.
 - (2) Binder course: three inches.
 - (3) Item #4: six inches.
- D. The exact depth can be adjusted based upon the existing surface, provided the total depth of pavement is five inches and base is six inches, minimum.
- E. Existing drainage conditions will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the Town Engineer and Highway Superintendent to determine the extent of improvements necessary.

The Engineering Department (Department) received the attached bond return request regarding the referenced project.

This Department performed a field inspection of the referenced property on February 22, 2024 to evaluate the current status of the site construction, for the purpose of determining whether a bond return is warranted. The results of our investigation are presented below.

The original bond amount posted was \$48,300.00. Based upon our inspection of July 29, 2015, all of the site improvements required pursuant to the Board's Site Plan approval were completed with the exception of the common driveway.

It was recommended in July of 2015 that the bond be reduced to \$22,000.00 and that upon completion of the common driveway the reminder of the bond can be returned. The common driveway is stabilized with the need for some minor grading.

This Department recommends that the remainder of the bond be returned at this time.

Inframark, the operators for Carmel Sewer District #8 (CSD 8), has advised the Engineering Department (Department) that the comminutor (sewage grinder) used at CSD #8 is not functioning.

Inframark has advised this Department that the GP Jager is the sole source supplier for this unit. This Department therefore considers this particular manufacturer to be a sole source at a cost of \$32,867.83. The replacement of this unit was included in the 2024 budget.

It should be noted that the prior unit was installed in June 2014 and has delivered almost 10 years of continuous service and that the repair of the unit exceeds 50% of the complete replacement cost.

This is a potential compliance issue as the comminutor is not currently working and a blockage could occur, causing a raw wastewater overflow. The Town of Carmel would be in violation of our State Pollution Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Permit. This Department requests that the Town Board authorize the purchase of the comminutor and installation as outlined in the attached quote, as an emergency installation.

This Department respectfully requests that this request be placed on the next Town Board work session.


