We understand that the Town has budgeted \$260,000 and \$225,000 in 2018 for Fire Protection District No. 1 and No. 2, respectively. By continuing to contribute an amount that is in excess of the calculated program contribution, the Town will help accelerate the program's funding progress and reduce future calculated contributions. Penflex continues to recommend that the Town contribute the full amount budgeted for each Program. For more details regarding the change in contributions for each specific program, as well as a five-year projection of required contributions, please refer to the Special Commentary and Exhibit VIII of each Annual Report.

The chart below details the funded ratio of each program. In calculating the annual cost of the program, the goal is to approach a 100% funded ratio over time. The Trust Fund's favorable investment experience in 2017 and the Town's excess contribution helped increase the funded ratio of each program. As the Town continues to make the annually-calculated program contributions, we expect the funded ratio to gradually increase toward 100%. We will continue to monitor the program's funding progress.

The Trust Fund's favorable investment experience in 2017 and the Town's excess contribution helped increase in the funded ratio. As the Town continues to make the annually-calculated program contributions, we expect the funded ratio to gradually increase toward 100%.

The amortization schedule established for the January 1, 2016 unfunded program liability remains in place and is included as part of the calculated contribution with 13 years remaining in the original 15-year schedule. However, if the Town continues to make excess contributions and the funded ratio continues to improve more rapidly than expected this separate amortization schedule will likely be eliminated in the next year or two. The total unfunded liability for the program is \$546,765 as of January 1, 2018.

PARTICIPATION NOTES

Participants Scott Harkins, Thomas Stasiak, and Allan Whitney III reached the Entitlement Age during 2017 and became entitled to start collecting their accrued monthly service awards. In addition, John Tarr earned his first year of service credit in 2017 and was already over the Entitlement Age. Therefore, he became immediately vested and eligible to start collecting effective January 1, 2018.

Penflex has yet to receive completed *Payment Commencement Forms* for several individuals.
