AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CARMEL CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE TOWN OF CARMEL

WHEREAS the CARMEL CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereafter known as the "DISTRICT", is a municipal corporation of the State of New York, with offices at 81 South Street, Patterson, New York 12563 and the TOWN OF CARMEL, hereafter known as the "TOWN", is a municipal corporation of the State of New York with offices at Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York 10541; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Law Section 414, DISTRICT has in the past allowed the TOWN, it contractors, agents, servants and employees to use the facilities of the DISTRICT for recreational purposes for Town sponsored activities at no charge, and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT, in view of the continuing escalating capital and maintenance costs required to maintain and improve its recreational facilities, can no longer continue to provide the use of such facilities to the TOWN;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the CARMEL CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE TOWN OF CARMEL that:

FIRST: The DISTRICT shall furnish to said TOWN the use of three ball fields identified as Fields #5, #6 and #7 (as per attached map) at Carmel High School, 30 Fair Street in the hamlet of Carmel for programs conducted by said TOWN, its contractors, agents, servants and employees for recreational purposes and for TOWN sponsored activities. Except when needed for use by the DISTRICT, the TOWN shall have exclusive use of the aforesaid fields as follows:

(Cont.)

1. Field #5

April 1st through June 30 for T-Ball Monday through Friday from 5:00 p.m. until sunset Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until sunset

September 1 through December 31 for Flag Football Sundays from 9:00 a.m. through 2:00 p.m.

2. Fields #6 and #7

April 1 through August 31 for Little League Monday through Friday from 6:00 p.m. until sunset Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until sunset

September 1 through December 31 for Flag Football Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until sunset

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CCSD AND TOWN OF CARMEL

In the event the TOWN fails to utilize the fields during the above times, the DISTRICT reserves the right to allow others to use said fields. The TOWN's programs shall be conducted by and remain under the direct supervision and control of the TOWN, its contractors, agents, servants and employees. The TOWN hereby agrees to defend and indemnify the DISTRICT, it officers and employees from any and all claims, suits or action for injury or damage to person(s) or property that may arise by reason of the TOWN's use of these facilities. The TOWN, it contractors, agents, servants, employees, patrons and invitees use these facilities at their own risk. This provision shall not be construed to indemnify the DISTRICT, its officers, employees or agents for damage arising out of bodily injury to persons or damage to property caused by or resulting from the negligence of the DISTRICT, its officers, employees or agents.

For the use of said facilities, the TOWN agrees to make the following capital improvements to the fields and to perform the following maintenance:

Capital Improvements

1. Fields #6 and #7

Improvements to the infield clay and surrounding grass areas at a cost of \$2,000/year

Provide a port-a-potty April through November for each year of this contract. The estimated cost of such is \$720/year

Shared Services


TOWN OF CARMEL

The TOWN shall deliver sand and salt to the DISTRICT from the town garage. The DISTRICT will reimburse the TOWN at their cost. The DISTRICT shall be responsible for mowing.

The TOWN shall provide use of field maintenance equipment as requested by the DISTRICT. Examples: Aerator, York Rake, Top Dresser, Field Lining Equipment, etc.

This Agreement shall be effective from April 1, 2015 and ending March 31, 2016, with the option of rolling over for two additional one year periods dependent upon consent of both parties.

"THE PEDESTRIAN LIGHTING AND SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT" - ROUTE 6N/SOUTH LAKE BOULEVARD - DETERMINATION MADE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 2 OF THE EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEDURE LAW

WHEREAS, the Town of Carmel has undertaken a public improvements project known as "The Pedestrian Lighting and Sidewalk Improvement Project" located on Route 6N/South Lake Boulevard in downtown Mahopac ("The Project") regarding the installation of certain lighting improvements along Route 6N in the Hamlet of Mahopac; and

WHEREAS, the project is being funded through Multi-Modal #4 Grant from the New York State Department of Transportation as well as through Good Neighbor Funding from the City of New York Department of Environmental Protection; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Carmel has been advised that the acquisition of certain easement interests over private property are required for the installation of the improvements proposed for The Project; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Carmel has acquired certain easement interests by voluntary conveyance from owners of certain properties upon which easement interests were required for said project; and

WHEREAS, The Town Board has previously authorized the commencement of eminent domain proceedings for the purposes of securing any and all remaining easement interests necessary for the construction and completion of The Project;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Carmel has reviewed and considered all aspects of The Project including those which pertain to the easement interests necessary to be acquired; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that The Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby determines that easement acquisitions required for the parcels known and designated as Town of Carmel Tax Map Nos. 75.44-1-44; 75.44-1-45; and 75.44-1-51 required for completion of the Project are de minimis in nature, so that the public interest will not be prejudiced by the construction of The Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Carmel further determines the following above properties are de minimis in nature is based upon the following:

- The easements sought are comprised solely of areas improved by sidewalks located between the existing buildings located at the referenced properties and U.S. Route 6N;
- Only lighting/lamp structures will be installed above ground within the easement areas and all conduit and wiring to be installed within the easement areas will be buried below ground surface;
- As part of the referenced project, the existing sidewalks on the referenced properties will be completely replaced with new concrete sidewalks and the existing overhead wiring service to the proposed new lighting fixtures will be removed and replaced with subsurface service;
- The interests sought to be acquired over the referenced properties are not fee interests and the property owners will maintain full use of the easement area in any manner which does not interfere with the easement rights sought to be acquired;
- None of the easements sought to be acquired interferes with and/or proposes alterations to the existing buildings located on the referenced properties.



Supervisor Schmitt thanked the Putnam County Sherriff's Department for assisting the Town of Carmel Police Department in providing law enforcement on Lake Mahopac.

PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

(Cont.)

David Krebs identified a mathematical error contained in the resolution authorizing the extension/renewal of the existing agreement for information technology services with Sullivan Data Management, Inc. which was carried over from the corresponding memo from the Town Engineer.

Supervisor Schmitt thanked Mr. Krebs for pointing it out and indicated that the matter would be reviewed and if necessary, the resolution would be amended.

Mr. Krebs cited detailed cost comparisons with regard to the proposals of Sullivan Data Management and Euro Video Productions and concluded that the increase proposed by Euro Video Productions would amount to less than what was authorized for Sullivan Data Management. He spoke regarding the services currently being provided by Euro Video Productions, and questioned whether or not Alesca Productions can continue to provide the video recording services at the prices proposed. Mr. Krebs commented that the RFP exemption that was applied for information technology services because of confidentiality and security reasons should apply to video recording services as well.

Thom Ianniccari commented that the Greater Mahopac-Carmel Chamber of Commerce would like to make sure that the public will have clear access to the affected storefronts throughout the construction of the Pedestrian Lighting and Sidewalk Improvement Project.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that the bid specifications that will be provided to the vendors in connection with the project will contain language with regard to ensuring access. However, there may be short periods of time with access limitations.

Michael Barile expressed his support with regard to the appointment of Michael Cazzari as Chief of Police.

Mr. Barile agreed with the comments made earlier by Mr. Krebs and suggested that the Town Board revisit the extension/renewal of the existing agreement for information technology services with Sullivan Data Management and the proposals for the video recording of Town meetings.

Mr. Barile referenced a recent article that compared the region's Workers' Compensation injury cases and commented that the amount of Town of Carmel claims appeared proportionately skewed.

Supervisor Schmitt explained that in addition to the Highway Department and the Police Department, the volunteer fire departments and ambulance corps are included in Town of Carmel claims. He pointed out that the numbers have been declining over the years. Discussion ensued.

Anne Vlattas read a letter to the Town Board on behalf of Diane Ionta Krebs who was presently videotaping the Town Board meeting for Euro Video Productions. In the letter, Ms. Ionta Krebs described her experience in the video production industry. She then questioned the experience and references of Domenic Zecca of Alesca Productions. Ms. Ionta Krebs stated her disappointment with the Town Board and the recommendation of the Town Engineer in connection with the matter and highlighted the experience of Euro Video Productions.

The American Legion Post 1080 will also host a ceremony at noon at 333 Buckshollow Road and an additional ceremony with refreshments will be held at afterward at the Post Home.
