As you are aware, Bibeau is moving forward with the final house services connections, tie ins, restoration, and also the additional work for the abandonment of the old mains on the project. As John Folchetti documented in the progress meeting #14 minutes, the house service connections are moving forward more rapidly than initially forecast, however the additional abandonment work will take some time. In addition to these abandonments, Bibeau experienced an array of weather related delays and was not permitted to work on the local roads when inclement weather was forecast, was directed to install 5 additional hydrants, 7 additional 6" gate valves, additional 8" gate valves, 250 feet of watermain on Highridge Rd, 350 feet of watermain on Harbor Lane and also additional house services on both streets. As a result, Bibeau is requesting an extension of time above and beyond the original contract end date of April 14, 2013 to a substantial completion date of May 17, 2013 (25 additional work days). PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

Kenneth Schmitt

No member of the public wished to comment at this time.

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TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Supervisor Schmitt stated that the Town of Carmel's Community Clean-up and Zoning Code Compliance Week was held recently and that Michael Carnazza, Director of Code Enforcement/Building Inspector will be providing a comprehensive report to the Town Board with regard to the matter at the next Work Session to be held on May 8, 2013.

OPEN FORUM - PUBLIC COMMENTS

Michael Barile stated that he hoped that Mr. Carnazza's report will address a timeframe for the removal of the oil barrels, banners, flags, and clothing bins that remain up in the community.

Mr. Barile expressed his frustration with the appearance of the two large banners currently stacked across Route 6 in Mahopac as well as the signage posted in the Town promoting events taking place outside of the Town. He suggested that the Town Board consider eliminating such banners and designating a central location(s) for the many charitable organizations to erect signage to promote their events.

Supervisor Schmitt agreed that the stacked banners may be inappropriate and discussion was held regarding the matter.

OPEN FORUM - TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Councilwoman McDonough announced that there will be a pancake breakfast fundraiser at Chili's Restaurant in Somers on May 5, 2013 to benefit the Special Olympics.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the American Cancer Society will "Paint the Town Purple" as purple decorations will be displayed throughout the community on May 3, 2013 to raise awareness of their annual Relay for Life fundraiser. He noted that a purple line will be painted down a portion of Route 6 in Mahopac for the event.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that commencing May 11, 2013, a recycling container will be available for the disposal of electronic equipment (e-waste) every Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Putnam County Highway Facility salt storage shed located on Route 6N in Mahopac Falls.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that on May 8, 2013, the Town Board Work Session will be held in the Richard Othmer Conference Room at Town Hall because the Planning Board Chairman and Legal Counsel anticipate that the attendance at the Planning Board meeting that evening will necessitate the usage of both meeting rooms.

All agenda items having been addressed, on motion by Councilwoman McDonough, seconded by Councilman Lupinacci, with all Town Board members present and in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 8:06 p.m. to Executive Session to discuss a matter of personnel with Labor Counsel.
