<u>CARMEL CABLE TELEVISION, INC. - RESOLUTION OF OBJECTION AND OPPOSITION TO COMCAST'S DECISION TO CLOSE CARMEL SERVICE OFFICE</u>

WHEREAS, the Town of Carmel and Carmel Cable Television, Inc. (d/b/a Comcast) are parties to a Franchise Agreement dated November 1, 2005, wherein and whereby Comcast provides cable television and related services to thousands of residents and businesses within the Town of Carmel; and

WHEREAS, the subscribers of Comcast have recently been advised that the cable service office located on Old Route 6 in the Town of Carmel will be closing and that the office will be replaced by a new office located outside the state of New York; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Comcast intends to locate its service office in the City of Danbury, Connecticut, several miles outside the Town of Carmel at a site that is not geographically convenient to the residents of the Town of Carmel or to other Putnam County residents who subscribe to Comcast services for a number of reasons, not the least of which, that it is not served or reachable by public transportation originating in the Town of Carmel or Putnam County; and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Town Board that the provisions of the Agreement previously referred to were specifically intended to provide convenience to subscribers and that such convenience was contemplated as an integral part of the franchise arrangement between the Town and Comcast and

WHEREAS, it also is that sense of this Town Board that the unilateral decision by Comcast to relocate its service office at an inconvenient location outside the Town is in bad faith and adversely affects subscribers within the Town of Carmel;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Carmel hereby protests Comcast's actions and formally objects to the relocation of the only service center available to its residents to a point outside of Putnam County to an inconvenient location, not served by any mode of public transportation available to Carmel Residents; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town of Carmel shall file a formal complaint with Comcast and with the New York State Public Service Commission objecting to Comcast's breach of its responsibility to the residents and subscribers within the Town of Carmel and County of Putnam; and be it further

Supervisor Schmitt spoke in opposition to the relocation of Comcast's service center effective April 6, 2013 and recommended that Comcast's future franchise agreement with the Town of Carmel dictate that they maintain a local location.

Councilman Lupinacci also expressed his opposition, citing the length of time it takes to travel from the Town of Carmel to points within the City of Danbury, Connecticut.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town of Carmel's Community Clean-up and Zoning Code Compliance Week will be held from April 29, 2013 through May 3, 2013. In an effort to improve the appearance of the Town, the Building Department will be aggressively enforcing the Zoning Code with regard to illegal signs, banners, etc. Supervisor Schmitt urged all property owners to comply.

Councilman Lombardi added that the Building Department has been instructed in general, to issue just one warning before issuing a summons. He noted that a new fine schedule for code violations is currently being developed.

Councilman Lombardi urged residents to keep the Town of Carmel parks clean.

Supervisor Schmitt announced to water district residents that the Town of Carmel will be sending out the semi-annual water consumption bills at the end of the month and if not done so already, to call in meter readings to the Comptroller's Office, mail to Town Hall or enter on the Town's website at www.ci.carmel.ny.us. as soon as possible. For billing accuracy, he stressed the importance of actual usage readings as opposed to estimates.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town of Carmel received a check yesterday in the amount of \$129,000.00 from FEMA for Hurricane Sandy aid. He anticipates additional checks will follow as the Town is seeking reimbursement for over \$400,000.00 in costs incurred.

All agenda items having been addressed, on motion by Councilman Lupinacci, seconded by Councilman Lombardi, with all Town Board members present and in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 7:36 p.m. to Executive Session to discuss a matter of personnel in connection with the Building Department.
