#### PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS

Michael Barile confirmed with the Town Board that the County of Putnam would be assuming all costs involved with the feasibility study in connection with the proposed sewer collection system. He also confirmed that the project would involve Route 6 from Wallauer's Design Center to Baldwin Place, and that all properties along the corridor would be included in the sewer district. Discussion ensued.

### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS**

No member of the Town Board wished to comment at this time.

### PUBLIC COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM

Mr. Barile addressed possible violations that may be imposed on homeowners as well as the Town of Carmel in connection with the small dam on Lake Mahopac. Mr. Barile inquired about the ownership of the dam, and if the issue was related to the Town Board's December 2012 authorization of an engineering study for hazard classification that he said was never completed or submitted to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for review.

Gregory Folchetti explained that the DEC's position on who the owners of that dam are is based upon the Environmental Conservation Law. Their position is that there are four owners of property that actually physically own fee interest in the area that comprises a portion or all of the impoundment and that the Town is also an owner because they operate and control the dam. Mr. Folchetti stated that the hazard classification study was completed and has nothing to do with the DEC's contentions about who the owners are and their attempt to enforce against the five owners, including the Town of Carmel.

Mr. Barile asked if these problems are arising because the Town did not submit what the DEC wanted.

Mr. Folchetti replied, not at all.

### **TOWN BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS - OPEN FORUM**

Councilwoman McDonough announced the remaining schedule for the 2017 Town of Carmel Recreation and Parks Department Sunset Concert Series as well as for the Fall Concert Series to be held at the Mahopac Chamber Park.

Councilman Lupinacci announced that the Recreation and Parks Department has commenced registration for their 2017 Fall Roller Hockey clinic, youth league and adult league. Further information is available from the Department of Recreation and Parks or Mahopac Roller Hockey.

Councilman Lombardi announced that the Recreation and Parks Department is partnering with the Putnam Arts Council to offer Painting on Location at the Beach on Lake Mahopac. The course will be held on Mondays commencing September 11, 2017. Further information is available from the Department of Recreation and Parks or the Putnam Arts Council.

Councilman Lombardi announced that the Recreation and Parks Department will be offering Intro to Recreational Kayaking on Lake Mahopac beginning on September 6, 2017. Registration commences August 14, 2017. Further information is available from the Department of Recreation and Parks.

Councilman Schneider announced that the Town of Carmel 2017 Fall Sunset Yoga on Lake Mahopac begins on September 5, 2017. Registration commences August 14, 2017. Further information is available from the Department of Recreation and Parks.

Councilwoman McDonough announced that the opening reception for Putnam Arts Council's exhibition, "Timeless" will be on August 13, 2017 from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and continue through August 27, 2017.

Councilman Lombardi reflected on the recent Purple Heart Remembrance Ceremony held at the Putnam County Veterans Memorial Park.

Supervisor Schmitt announced that the Town Board will meet next at their Work Session to be held on August 16, 2017.
