### TOWN BOARD MEETING TOWN HALL, MAHOPAC, N.Y.

A Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Carmel was called to order by Supervisor Kenneth Schmitt on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January 2013 at 7:12 p.m. at Town Hall, 60 McAlpin Avenue, Mahopac, New York. Members of the Town Board present by roll call were: Councilman Schneider, Councilman Lupinacci, Councilwoman McDonough, Councilman Lombardi and Supervisor Schmitt.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was observed prior to the start of official business and a moment of silence was observed to honor those serving in the United States Armed Forces.

#### **CARMEL TOWN-WIDE GARBAGE COLLECTION**

Supervisor Schmitt read the following prepared statement.

The Town of Carmel awarded a Town-wide residential garbage and recycling pick up contract that went into effect January 1, 2013. The Garbage District was established in 1985 pursuant to Article 12-A of New York Town Law and was approved by referendum vote of approximately 4 to 1 thereafter. In 2010 the Town Board discussed at several televised public meetings its desire to solicit bids for residential garbage and recycling hauling on a Town-wide basis. Ultimately the subject was tabled in mid-year. Beginning in mid-2012, the Town Board again discussed at several televised public meetings, the possibilities of seeking competitive bids for town wide residential garbage and recycling pick up. Over the course of multiple Town Board meetings the preparation of bid specifications for the project was discussed and the specifications were ultimately developed by Town employees and board members.

By resolution passed at its August 15, 2012 meeting, the Town Board authorized the solicitation of competitive bids for the project pursuant to the provisions of New York General Municipal Law. The August 15th meeting was an open meeting where any interested parties could be present and ask questions regarding the bid. The bid involved was a sealed bid with a deadline that where all bids were publicly opened at Town Hall on October 17, 2012.

When the lowest bidder presented a proposal for approximately \$22 per month per residence, it appeared clear that a substantial savings to the Town residents would result if the bid were awarded. This determination was made in light of the fact that the maximum rate permitted to be charged under Town Code was \$34.50 per month for comparable garbage and recycling pickup service.

Thereafter, the Town Board and Town employees began doing extensive inquiry and research to determine if the lowest bidder was indeed responsible. When other municipalities that were presently contracting with the AAA Carting were contacted, there were very few complaints regarding services they had been providing for years. Having otherwise met the remaining terms and provisions of the bid specifications, it was evident that the low bidder AAA Carting was in fact a responsible bidder. Having made such a determination, the Town Board was bound under the General Municipal Law to award the bid to AAA Carting if the Board was to proceed and award the bid at all.

On November 7, 2012, the bid for the residential garbage and recycling pickup was awarded to AAA Carting by resolution of the Town Board. This meeting was an open meeting where any interested parties could be present and ask questions regarding the bid.

At no time were any of the Town Board members informed or made aware that any criminal investigation regarding AAA Carting or any other carter doing business in the Town of Carmel was ongoing. To the extent that the indictments which have been announced involve members of AAA Carting, the Town Board

will consult with its counsel regarding any affect on the existing contract. Any action taken by the Town Board in this regard would be taken at a Town Board meeting open to the public, as all such Town Board actions are. Given these facts, we believe the best interest of the public was protected and acted upon when awarding the contract to the lowest responsible bidder for town wide garbage. Our goal as your Town Board is to continue looking out for the best interest of our residents and businesses while delivering the most efficient services at the least costly prices. Thank you.

Supervisor Schmitt added that AAA Carting is continuing to collect trash in the Town of Carmel pursuant to the terms contained in their contract, and that anyone who states that the Town Board had any knowledge with regard to the ongoing federal investigation is mistaken.

Councilman Lombardi spoke regarding the Town of Carmel's compliance with the provisions of New York State law in connection with the bidding process for town-wide garbage collection. He expressed his frustration with members of the public who made disparaging remarks on social media websites directed at people of a certain ethnicity.

Councilman Lupinacci reiterated that at no time was the Town Board aware of the FBI's investigation. He commented on the need to focus on the positive aspects of the townwide garbage collection program.

Section 1.
