TOWN OF CARMEL Local Law No. for the Year 2011

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Carmel as follows:

A new Chapter 118 to be entitled On-Site Sanitary Systems is hereby added to the Town Code of the Town of Carmel to read as follows:

Chapter 118: On-site Sanitary Systems

Section 118-1: Purpose and Intent.

The Town of Carmel hereby finds that it is necessary to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town of Carmel that on-site sanitary systems operate and be maintained in a manner that will prevent, to the extent possible, hazards to the public health, to minimize their potential for failure and to protect the drinking water supplies which pass through the Town of Carmel.

(Cont.)

This local law is intended to implement the provisions of Part IX.A.3.b of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, SPDES General Permit GP-0-10-002 ("Permit") for Stormwater Discharge from Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) effective May 1, 2010, which requires that the Town implement and enforce a program to ensure that on-site sanitary systems are inspected and, where necessary, maintained or rehabilitated as required by Part IX.A.3.b of the Permit and/or similar provisions in successor Permits.

Section 118-2: Definitions.

APPEALS AUTHORITY shall mean the Municipal Code Enforcement Officer.

INSPECTION shall mean the evacuation and removal of septage as necessary from a Separate Sewage Disposal System/On-Site Sanitary System and subsequent reporting by a Septage Collector that is licensed by the Putnam County Department of Health.

MUNICIPAL CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER shall mean the Building Inspector of the Town of Carmel, Assistant Building Inspector of the Town of Carmel or any other individual duly authorized by resolution of the Town Board of the Town of Carmel.

SEPARATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM/ON-SITE SANITARY SYSTEM, a system or facilities or means for the treatment or modification or ultimate disposal of waterborne sewage or domestic wastes or trade wastes or offensive material, each being designed for the treatment of less than 1,000 gallons per day, regardless of location with respect to any building or structure or premises thereby served. Such system shall include, but shall not be limited to, septic tanks, cesspools, absorption fields and other facilities for the treatment or modification or required control of sewage.

SEPTAGE COLLECTOR, an individual or entity licensed by the Putnam County Health

Department who engages in the performance of any one (1) or more of the following services, or who offers to provide any one (1) or more of the following services for a fee, in Putnam County, with respect to separate sewage disposal systems: evacuation, removal, collection or transportation of septage.

SEPTAGE shall mean the contents of any container including but not limited to a septic tank, which is designed and intended to hold sewage.

SEWAGE shall mean the combination of human and household waste with water which is discharged to the home plumbing system including the waste from a flush toilet, bath, sink, lavatory, dishwashing or laundry machine, or the water-carried waste from any other fixture, equipment or machine.

Section 118-3: Inspections and Requirements.

- Beginning on May 1, 2010, the owner of any parcel located within the Town of Carmel which relies upon a Separate Sewage Disposal System/On-Site Sanitary System shall cause an inspection to be performed on said Separate Sewage Disposal System/On-Site Sanitary System at a minimum frequency of once every five (5) years.
- Upon the completion of any inspection, every owner shall maintain a copy of the record os such inspection, which will be provided to the owner by the Septage Collector, for a minimum of six(6) years.
- The Septage Collector shall furnish one (1) copy of the record of inspection to the Municipal Code Enforcement Officer in the town/village in which the Separate Sewage Disposal System/On-Site Sanitary System is located and one (1) copy of the record of inspection of the Putnam County Soil and Water District Office.

Section 118-4: Waivers/Variance.

The Appeals Authority shall not grant a waiver or exemption from any of the requirements of this local law provided, however, that the Appeals Authority may vary the time requirements as referenced within this local law, upon the submission and consideration of evidence which may necessitate an extension of time to comply with all aspects of this local law. Such extension shall not exceed one hundred eighty (180) days.

(Cont.)

Section 118-5: Enforcement and Penalties.

Any owner of a parcel which is located in the Town of Carmel and is served by a Separate Sewage Disposal System/On-Site Sanitary System that fails to comply with the provision of this local law, shall be guilty of a violation, and shall be subject to a penalty as follows:

- (1) The Municipal Code Enforcement Officer shall first issue a written notice of
 - violation to the owner informing the owner of the anticipated imposition of penalties if the violation is not corrected within thirty (30) days.
- (2) Any person or corporation, whether as owner, lessee, principal, agent, employee or otherwise, which violates any of the provisions of this chapter or permits any such violation or fails to comply with any of the requirements thereof shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars, for conviction of a first offense: for conviction of a second offense both of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine of not less than three hundred fifty dollars no more than seven hundred dollars and upon conviction of a third or subsequent offense all of which were committed within a period of five years, punishable by a fine not less than seven hundred dollars not more than one thousand dollars. For the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers generally, violations of this chapter or any part thereof or any condition or requirement of subdivision approval shall be deemed misdemeanors. Each fourteen day (14) period of continued violation shall constitute a separate additional violation.

Section 118-6: Compliance with Other Laws.

Compliance with this local law shall not be deemed compliance or approval of the municipality under any other rules, regulations codes or laws.

Section 118-7: Severability.

In the event that any provision of this local law shall be held unconstitutional or unlawful, the remaining provisions in this local law shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 118-8: Effective Date.

Resolution

This local law shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

Prohibited Activities By Dogs

It shall be unlawful for any owner of any dog in the Town to permit or allow such dog to:

A. Run at large unless the dog is accompanied by its owner or a responsible person and under the full control of such owner or person. For the purpose of this Article, a dog or dogs hunting in the company of a hunter or hunters shall be considered as accompanied by its owner.

B. Engage in habitual and loud howling, barking, crying or whining or conduct as to unreasonably and habitually disturb the comfort of any person other than the owner

comfort of any person other than the owner of such dog.
C. Uproot, dig, or otherwise damage any vegetables, lawns, flowers, garden beds, or other property without the consent or approval of the owner of such property.
D. Chase, jump upon or at, or otherwise harass any person in such manner as to reasonably cause intimidation or fear or to put such person in reasonable apprehension of bodily harm.
E. Habitually chase, run alongside of or bark at motor vehicles, motorcycles or

bark at motor vehicles, motorcycles or bloycles while on a public street, highway, or place, or upon private property without the consent or approval of the owner of such

property.

F. Create a nulsance by defecating. urinating or digging on public property or on private property without the consent or approval of the owner of such property.

G. If a female dog, when in heat, be off the owner's premises.

How to License your Dog

New York State law requires the licensing of every dog over four months old.

To apply for a dog license, residents of the Town of Carmel may mail or bring this form along the following to the Town Clerk's Office:

- Proof of current rabies vaccination signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine;
- Spay/Neutering Certificate if applicable; (If the Rabies Certificate indicates that your dog is altered, we will accept that in the Space of the Space of the Incidence of the Incid the Spay/Neutering Certificate.)
- Appropriate License Fee* Un-spayed/Un-neutered

After the application and appropriate certificates are filed and the license fee has been paid, the license will be validated for one year. Each dog is assigned a permanent official identification (ID) number and issued a metal ID tag which is to be attached to the dog's collar. License renewals will be mailed yearly from the office of the Town Clerk

Sycamore Bark Park is located within Sycamore Park at 790 Long Pond Road in Mahopac. The park includes two separate fenced areas for both large and small (under 30 lbs.) dogs. The park is open for members only from 8:00 a.m. to sunset, seven days a week. Dogs must be licensed, and have visible vaccination and ID tags. There is a limit of three dogs per adult handler, and all posted rules must be adhered to. All dog park users must complete a Bark Park Membership Form and submit a resident fee of \$25.00 per year per family with current Town of Carmel ID card. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Peter Creegan verified that the Public Hearing scheduled for April 20th related to the MS4 program mandates discussed at the previous Work Session.

Councilman Ravallo pointed out that the proposed Local Law involves compliance with federal and state, non-monetary provisions.

Councilman Lombardi added that the purpose of the proposed Local Law is to implement septic system inspections.

David Gagliardi inquired why the resolutions with regard to the litigation settlements did not contain the names of the corporations owning the properties. He also inquired about the locations of the properties.

Councilman Lombardi stated that the names of the property owners were provided in the resolutions, BWP Distributors, Inc. and BBJ Associates, LLC.

Gregory Folchetti, Legal Counsel explained that the litigation settlements were originally authorized in December. However, the tax map number was incorrect on the resolution with regard to the BWP Distributors, Inc. The years needed to be modified with regard to BBJ Associates, LLC. He stated the BBJ Associates, LLC property location to be the Shoprite Plaza. Unsure of the location of BWP Distributors, Inc., he stated that he would provide it to Mr. Gagliardi at a later date.

Ken Levy appealed to the Town Board for assistance with regard to damage that his vehicle sustained due to a pothole in the parking lot of the Post Office in Carmel. He stated that he reported the pothole and registered a complaint to the supervisor of the Post Office. To date, no action has been taken.

Councilman Ravallo explained that the Town Board has no authority over private property or property owned by the federal government.

Councilman Lombardi suggested that Mr. Levy provide the office of the Town Supervisor with further details and a letter may be sent out from the Town with regard to the dangerous situation. Discussion was held regarding the matter.
